INTRODUCTORY

1 The Household Economic Tables are special feature of the 1961—Census, because the economic data has been collected and tabulated for the first time on a household basis. They have been prepared on 20% samples of the data collected in respect of the households in Part I of household Schedule. The Schedule has been designed to collect data on the principal economic activities of the Households, viz., cultivation and household industry. The form and instructions for filling up the same are given in Annexure—I.

Household :

2 A Household means the entire group of persons who commonly live together in the same census house and take their meals from a common mess unless the exigencies of work prevent them from doing so. By definition, therefore, a census Household cannot be treated as a 'Family'. The Household includes persons who are not members of the family but are residing with the family at the time of Census enumeration. The term has been explained in detail in Annexure --I

3 Data have been compiled basing on 20% of the returns of the households recorded in the Household Schedule in respect of :-

- (i) Extent of land under cultivation.
- (ii) nature of Household Industry.
- (iii) period of working of Household Industry, and

- (iv) number of persons who are employed therein, either as family workers or as hired labourers.

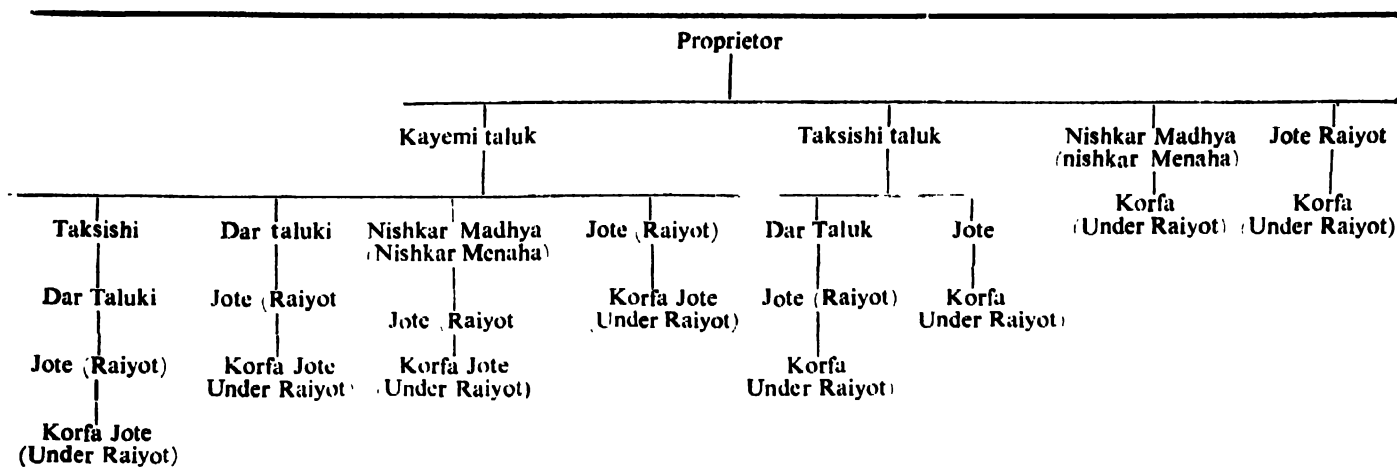
Besides these, information on the size and composition of Households has also been compiled in this Part on the basis of information collected in Part II Census Population Record.

4 Information furnished in the tables, therefore, relates either to land under actual cultivation, or to household industry or to both conducted by households themselves. Land includes all land normally used for cultivation purposes including temporary fallows. Cultivation involves ploughing, sowing and harvesting and does *not* include fruit-growing or keeping orchards or groves or working for plantations, like tea, coffee, rubber, cinchona and other medicinal plantation. The agricultural tables are confined only to households owning or holding land under cultivation.

Land Tenure :

5 According to instructions, if a household cultivates land owned or held from Government or taken from private persons for cultivation purposes, the local name of the right on such land has been recorded in the Household Schedule. The following is a list of local names of different rights on land as were obtaining in Tripura during the census period :

| (1) Proprietor | The proprietary right over all lands within the Union Territory of Tripura is vested with the President of the Republic of India as it is a Centrally Administered Territory. |
| (2) Tenure-holders | <p>Tenure holder means primarily a person who has acquired from the Proprietor or from another tenure-holder a right to hold land for the purposes of collecting rents or bringing it under cultivation by establishing tenants on it. There are four kinds of such intermediaries as detailed below :-</p> <p>a) Kayemi taluk—This right is permanent, heritable and transferable and the rent or rate of rent is fixed in perpetuity.</p> <p>(b) Taksishi taluk—This is also transferable and heritable but the rent can be revised after a stipulated period varying from 10 to 25 years.</p> <p>c) Nishkar-tenure Nishkar Madhya swatva—Here the land is held rent free on the strength of a valid taidad or "Sanad" granted by Their Highnesses the Maharajas of Tripura.</p> <p>(d) Dar taluk— This is also another intermediary right held under another talukder whether Kayemi, Taksishi or Nishkar tenure.</p> |

He may hold mediately or immediately under the proprietor. The right is permanent, heritable and transferable but the rent can be revised after 7 to 12 years according to the stipulation. |

(Under Raiyot) | That is to say, tenants holding immediately under Raiyot for his personal use and occupation. By an order of the Revenue Department dated 17-3-1958 this right is protected under sub Sections (C), (D) & (E) of Section 48 of the Tenancy Act ACT VIII of 1885 and by a ruling given by the hon'ble Judicial Commissioner in case No. 17 of 1950 on 2-7-1951. |

Household Industry :

6 Sub-Part B of Part I of the Schedule relates to Household Industry. In this sub-part, data regarding the nature of the household industry and the number of months in the year during which it is conducted, has been collected.

7 The household industry has been defined as an industry (not on the scale of a registered factory) conducted by the head of the household himself and/or mainly members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas and only at home in urban areas.

8 In rural areas, participation by members of the household is possible if the household industry is located at home or within the village, because village organisation is such that it makes it possible for the members of the household to move about freely in the village to look after their work.

9 In urban areas, such free movement may not be possible and, therefore, household industry has been restricted there only to those industries which are located at home. Where, however, part of the work is done outside the house, and the main operation is conducted within the house, the industry has been considered as a household industry.

10 Information regarding the number of members of family working and hired workers only in household cultivation, or household industry or in both has been collected in sub-part C of Part I—Household Schedule.

Tabulation of Household Schedules :

11 The Tabulation is confined to only 20% of sample households.

Selection of Sample Household Schedules for preparation of the Household Economic Tables :

12 The instructions for sampling circulated in letter No. 6/7/61-RG, dated the 5th August, 1961 from the office of the Registrar General, India, were followed. These are reproduced below :

“For the purpose of tabulation every fifth household from the starting random household will be selected to make a 20% sample. The sample household will be marked continuously for rural areas of a tehsil/taluka and for urban areas of a district i.e., households left over in a household pad should be carried over to the next

household schedule pad for the selection of sample households.

Before making the sample households the household schedule pads should be arranged in the order of location code numbers of villages in a Taluka or Tehsil in the case of a rural area and in the order of the location code numbers of towns in a district for urban areas. The first sample household should be chosen randomly among the first five households in the first household schedule pad and stamped(s) as selected. This random number (random start) should be chosen separately for rural areas of each taluka/tehsil and for the urban area of the district. From the first random household every fifth household should be continuously stamped as selected. A rubber stamp will have to be specially prepared for that purpose. The sample should be continuously marked for all the pads of villages in a tehsil and urban areas in a district. If in a particular household schedule pad at the end, some households (these will be four or less) are left after the marking of the sample household, the households left over should be carried over to the next household schedule pad and the appropriate household in that pad should be marked as a sample household.

In short the following points should be strictly followed while selecting the sample households.

- (i)(a) All pads of household schedules of rural areas of one tehsil should be arranged in order of ascending number of location codes of villages. If in a village more than one pad is used, these pads should also be arranged according to the serial number given to the pads for that village.
- (b) Similarly all pads of urban areas in a district should be arranged in ascending order of location code numbers. Within an urban area these pads will be arranged in the order of block numbers.
- (ii) After selection of the first sample schedule the sample will be continuously picked up without a break until the last pad of the Tehsil is exhausted in the rural areas and the district in urban areas.
- (iii) The sample households will be indicated by stamping the selected schedule in the right hand top corner with a rubber stamp (s).

(iv) The sample schedule (*i.e.*, those having rubber stamp mark) will be carefully removed from the pad and tied together for a tehsil in the sequence of villages within the tehsil and in the sequence of towns in the case of urban areas the slips being arranged in the same order as when the samples were removed.

(v) These bundles should be despatched to the office of the Registrar General, India, New Delhi.

(vi) In case two or more household schedules are utilised for a household on account of large size of the household all such schedules utilised for one household should be considered as one schedule for the purpose of counting every fifth schedule in the pad for sample selection.

(vii) The programme of selection of sample household schedules should be arranged in such a way that selected household schedules for one district are sent to this office every month by each Tabulation Office.

(viii) We are not concerned with institutions and, therefore, in taking out sample we should discard institutions and confine the samples only to family household. In counting every fifth household schedule, therefore, the schedule for institutional household should be left out, the order of the sample being confined only to the schedules of households."

13 Incidentally, it may be mentioned here that in the course of sampling it has been found that the total number of census houses used as institutions is 2,073 of which a classified numerical list of institutions in the territory is given below :

14 After sampling of households a thorough scrutiny of the sample household schedules has been undertaken so as to ensure that the sample households have been taken correctly and properly.

15 After completion of necessary scrutiny the sample schedules have been sent to the office of the Registrar General, India, for preparation of household Economic tables and Household tables on machines. The entire tabulation of the requisite data has been done in mechanical Tabulation office of Registrar General, India.

Coverage :

16 The total number of census households, according to Primary Census Abstract, stands at 216,488 of which 197,928 households are in rural and 18,560 in urban areas. The total number of households sampled comes to 42,997 or 19.86% of the total. The number of sampled households for rural and urban areas separately comes to 39,304 (or 19.86%) and 3,693 (or 19.90%) respectively. The percentages are in each case very slightly less than 20% as a result of random start of the sampling of 45 tehsils and 6 towns coupled with elimination of institutions. Examined from the population aspect also, it is seen that the population in sampled households comes to 226,248 (or 19.81% of the total population of 1,142,005). The percentage of population in sampled households in rural and urban areas to total rural and total urban comes respectively to 19.83 and 19.59, because of the exclusion of institutional population from sampling.

Tabulation

17 Altogether 12 tables (*e.g.*, 9 tables on household Economy, from B-X to B-XVII, 1 table on Household Composition (C-I) and 2 tables—SCT-V Parts A & B relating to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) have been compiled from the 20% sample schedules by mechanical process.

18 Table C-I has been presented in Sub-Part (ii) of Part-II and tables SCT—V Parts A & B in Part V—A of the Census publications. Only Household Economic Tables have appeared in this part.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING UP THE HOUSEHOLD SCHEDULE

At the top of the Schedule you will find the Location Code. You will have to write the Location Code of the household here. Your supervisor will give you the Code numbers representing your district, tehsil/thana/town, village/ward/block. You should take care to write these three numbers connected together by oblique strokes in between on every household schedule.

When you are visiting each household for enumeration you should write the code number of the household also on the Household Schedule. For purposes of the census a Census House has been defined as a structure or a part of structure, a dwelling, a shop, workshop, factory or place of business, or shop-cum-dwelling giving on the road or a common stair-case or a common courtyard leading to a main gate or enjoying a separate entrance. A household means the entire group of persons who commonly live together in the same census house and take their meals from a common mess unless the exigencies of work prevent them from doing so. In some census houses there may be more than one group of persons, each group with a common mess. In such cases, each group should be regarded as a separate household for purposes of the census and a separate household schedule should be prepared. You should write the household number from the extracts of the Houselist given to you by your supervisor. If, in any case, you find a census house or a household satisfying the definitions given above has not been numbered you should bring it to the notice of your supervisor and have a separate number given to the house or household and enumerate the household.

At the right hand corner of the Location Code you will find a question "Is this an Institution?" with a rectangle below it. If you are enumerating any penal, charitable or mental institution, hostel, hotel, hospital, boarding house, etc., you should write the nature of the institution within the rectangle like jail, hospital, etc.

Below the Location Code you will find a column for recording the full name of the Head of the household. The Head of the household for census pur-

poses is a person on whom falls the chief responsibility for the maintenance of the household. Thus the Head of the household need not necessarily be the eldest male member but may even be a female or a younger member of either sex. You need not, however, make any elaborate enquiry about this and should record as Head of household the name of the person who is actually acknowledged as such.

Institutions like boarding houses, messes and chummeries should also be regarded as census households but of 'unrelated persons living together'. In such a Household the manager or superintendent or the persons who has administrative responsibilities or who by common consent is regarded as the Head, should be recorded as Head of the Household. If in an Institution separate families are also living, each such family should be treated as a census household and a separate household schedule should be filled. In such cases the full name of the recognised Head of the household should be written.

If the Head of the household is a person who spends the week-days in town and spends the week-ends at home, he should be recorded as Head of Household and entered for enumeration at his home. If he should be away for a fairly long time which covers the entire enumeration period than the person who is incharge in his absence should be recorded as the Head of the household.

You will find a parallelogram at the right hand side against the Full name of the Head of the household marked "S.C/S.T". If the Head of the Household is a member of the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe obtaining in your State or in your District, you should write the name of the particular Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe to which the Head of the Household belongs within the parallelogram. If the Head of the Household does not belong to Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe you should put 'X' within the parallelogram.

You should then fill up the part of the household schedule relating to cultivation and Household Industry. Sub-part 'A' relates to Cultivation; Sub-part 'B' to Household Industry and sub-part 'C' to Workers at Cultivation or Household Industry.

Sub-part 'A' relating to Cultivation will have to be filled in only where the household cultivates land (Land includes all land normally used for cultivation purposes including temporary fallows). Three categories of land are given in items 1 (i), 1 (ii), and 2. Items 1 (i) and 1 (ii) relate to land actually cultivated by the household. Item 2 relates to land which is not cultivated by the household but has been given by it to private person for cultivation for payment in money, kind or share. In each of the three cases the total of separate plots or parcels of land in different places, owned or held, or taken or given should be made and entered. A number of lines have been provided for this purpose in 1 (i) and 1 (ii) to account for separate plots or parcels of land held or owned or taken under different recognised local rights. If the household (a) cultivates land owned or held from Government or taken from private persons or institutions or (b) has given land to private persons for cultivation purposes you should ascertain the local name of the right on such land and record in the column relating to 'local name of right on land'. Category 1 (i) land owned or held from Government, will include the total of all pieces of land owned or held in owner-like possession, e.g., land held directly from Government under a grant, lease or assignment, (i) with rights of permanent and heritable and transferable possession, (ii) with rights of permanent, and heritable possession, but without the right of transfer and (iii) temporary or conditional leases of any kind with the Government. Category 1 (ii) land taken from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share, will include land (i) with rights of permanent heritable and transferable possession (ii) with rights of permanent and, heritable possession, but without the right of transfer and (iii) temporary or conditional leases of any kind with Government, Category 1 (ii) land taken from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share, will include land (i) with rights of permanent, heritable and transferable possession, (ii) with rights of permanent and heritable possession but without right of transfer ; (iii) held in a variety of tenancies or tenures which may be broadly classified as follows :—

- (a) tenants holding land with permanent and heritable rights whose land cannot be resumed by the owner on grounds of perso-

nal cultivation (such tenants may in some cases have the right of transfer also);

- (b) tenants who have been given permanent rights subject to the right of resumption by the owner (in some cases the tenant has the right to acquire ownership of the non-resumable area. In other cases he does not possess the right);
- (c) tenants holding land in areas where interim-measures have been enacted for stay of ejectment or for continuing the leases for a specified period;
- (d) tenants holding land on temporary leases who are liable to ejectment ; and
- (e) areas held on condition of rendering service either to a village community or to Government (This also includes cases where labourers on plantations are given some land for cultivation with permanent rights) ; and
- (iv) the following :—
 - (a) land taken for a fixed amount of money,
 - (b) land taken for a fixed amount of produce,
 - (c) land taken for a share of the produce,
 - (d) land for which money is paid partly in one and partly in any other form mentioned above, and
 - (e) land held free of consideration.

Category 2-Land given to private persons for cultivation for payment in money, kind or share will include the classifications mentioned in category 1 (ii).

Category 1 (i) and (ii) will include only those plots or parcels of land which are cultivated by the household itself, that is lands which lie within the village, or in adjacent villages or within such a distance as enables the household to work on the land or actively supervise the cultivation. They will not include land owned or held in distant places where distance itself is a bar to active cultivation, constant supervision or direction. But Category 2 will include land in any part of the country whatsoever. You should ascertain the extent of land in each category

of local right in acres and record in the column relating to 'Area in acres'. You should write the total of separate plots or parcels of land under the same right if they are situated in different places. If it is not possible to ascertain the extent of land in acres you should, if possible, make a conversion from the local measure given to you. Even if this is not possible write the area in local measure giving invariably the name of the measure adopted.

This sub-part will not apply to household which do not possess any land. Thus, it will not apply to households which consists of only agricultural labourers without any land. In such cases put an 'X' in all the spaces provided in the right hand side and put a bold cross on this sub-part.

Land under any of the items in sub-part 'A' includes rent free land, lands enjoyed in permissive or gifts without encumbrance or consideration. A household which is a member of a co-operative farm will record only that amount of land in the co-operative farm which had belonged to it before and under right enter 'co-operative farm'. Labour hired by such a co-operative farm should not be entered for this household.

Sub-part 'B' relates to Household Industry. This part will be filled up only where there is a Household Industry conducted by the Head of the household himself and or mainly by members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas and only at home in urban areas. The industry should not be on the scale of a registered factory. The participation of the Head of the household and/or members of the household is an essential feature of the Household Industry. In a rural area the Household Industry can be located either at home or within the village. But in an urban area the Household Industry or at least the major part of its work must be located only at home. A household Industry should relate to production, processing, servicing or repairing and includes makers and sellers of goods.

Ascertain from the Head of the household whether there are any Household Industries and write the nature of the Industry (s) in the column provided, if there are any. Then ascertain for how many months in a year roughly they are conducted and put down the number of months in the appropriate column. If the industry is conducted through-

out the year write '12'. If there is no Household Industry of any sort put an 'X' in each of the places in the right hand corner where the answers will be written and put a bold cross on this sub-part.

Sub-part 'C' relates to Workers in Cultivation or Household Industry.

In the case of household which are engaged only in Cultivation, if the Head of the household is working write I under the column 'Head', and ascertain how many other male and female members of the family are working. Write the numbers in the respective columns. Write the total number of family workers including the Head, if he is working, in the column relating to 'Total'. Then ascertain whether any hired workers are employed and, if so, write the number of such workers in the column allotted for it. The hired workers should have been in wholtime employment during last working season or should be in wholtime employment during current working season.

Similarly in the case of households engaged in Household Industry only, if the head of the household is working write I in the column relating to the 'Head', and also ascertain how many male members and female members of the family are working and write the numbers in the respective columns. Write the total number of family workers including the Head, if he is working, in the column relating to 'Total' and then ascertain the number of hired workers, if any and then write the member of hired workers in the appropriate column.

If a household is engaged both in Cultivation and Household Industry ascertain whether the Head is working and write I under the column relating to the Head and also ascertain how many male and female members of the family are working both at Cultivation and the Household Industry and write the numbers in the respective columns. Write the total number of family workers in the column relating to total. Ascertain the number of hired workers engaged by the family both for Cultivation and Household Industry and write the number in the appropriate column. In a Household engaged both in Household Cultivation and Household Industry, you need not ascertain how many are engaged in Household Cultivation and Household Industry separately.

Even if any of the members of the family working or hired labourers are absent during the period of the census count they should be counted for the purposes of the Household Schedule.

In the case of household engaged in Cultivation only, put 'X' in the columns relating to 'Household Industry only' and 'Both in Household Cultivation and Household Industry'. Similarly, in the case of Households engaged in Household Industry only, put 'X' in the columns relating to 'Household Cultivation only' and 'Both in Household Cultivation and

Household Industry'. If a household is engaged both in Household Cultivation and Household Industry put 'X' in the columns relating to 'Household Cultivation only' and 'Household Industry only'. If a household is not engaged in either Household Cultivation or Household Industry or both put 'X' in all the columns and a bold 'X' on this sub-part.

The test for a worker is whether a person is actually working in Cultivation or Household Industry or supervising or directing work thereon.

2 Column 8 of the table shows that there are two cultivating households in each of which the family worker is a female worker in the size classes of 7.5—9.9, and 10.0—12.4 acres in rural areas of Kalyanpur tehsil and Salgara tehsil respectively. The surmise may be that the lands in these cases may have been left entirely fallow or it may be that they are partly under cultivation and partly left as fallow.

1. This table which gives data on the basis of 20% sample for total, rural and urban, is intended to show family sizes distributed according to one member, small, medium, large and very large families.

2. The table gives data for sample households classified into (i) those engaged neither in cultivation nor in household industry, (ii) those engaged in household industry only and (iii) those others engaged in cultivation further cross classified by sizes of family into (i) single member, (ii) 2-3 members, (iii) 4-6 members, (iv) 7-9 members and (v) 10 members and over.

3. By definition, a 'Census Household' is not the same as a 'Family'. The household includes persons who are not members of the family but are resi-

ding with the family during the census period. The number of families having outsiders being negligible, the table gives a general idea of the family sizes.

4. The data for total number of households and total household population by total, rural and urban shown in the Appendix to this Table, have been taken from Table A-I and its Appendix III. The total number of households appearing therein include number of institutions.

5. The average size of household (excluding inmates of institutions and houseless persons) comes to 5.24 in rural and 5.46 in urban areas whereas the average size of family (excluding unrelated persons) comes to 5.19 in rural and 5.28 in urban areas. The size of either household or family remains higher in urban areas.

**SPECIAL TABLES ON SCHEDULED CASTES
AND SCHEDULED TRIBES.**

INTRODUCTORY

Prior to Independence, the decennial Censuses in the princely State of Tripura were conducted under supervision of the Superintendent of Census Operations of Bengal. The first decennial Census after Independence and integration of the princely state of Tripura with the Union of India was conducted in 1951 under supervision of the Superintendent of Census Operations, Assam. The Census of 1961 was conducted, as in other States and Union Territories, by a separate Superintendent of Census Operations exclusively for Tripura with a full-fledged set up for Census enumeration, sorting, tabulation and publication of Census Tables and Reports. The Census data in respect of Tripura for the Censuses upto 1911, therefore, appeared in the Census Tables and Reports of Bengal. In 1931 a census report in Bengali was brought out by the then Government of the Ruler based on the Census data published in the Imperial and Provincial tables and the Census Report of Bengal. No separate report was published by the then Tripura Government for 1941 Census. A Census Hand Book of 1951 Census was published by the Government of Tripura on the basis of the data compiled for the Census Tables of Assam. Beside this, data of 1951 Census for Tripura are available in the combined tables and Report for Assam, Manipur and Tripura. For any comparative study on castes and tribes of Tripura references have to be sought in Bengal tables and reports upto 1941 Census and Assam volumes for 1951 Census.

People belonging to the tribal communities are the original settlers in Tripura. The cultivation by jhuming on the hills, pursued under special physical environments have, however, prevented them from making any permanent settlement.

The original home of Chakmas and Maghs of Tripura was probably the Chittagong Hill Tracts and of Garos, the northern part of Mymensingh District of East Pakistan. Similarly Lushais might have migrated from Lushai Hills, Khasias from Assam, Bhutias and Lepchas from the Himalayan region of

Bengal, and Mundas, Santals and Bhils from Bengal, Bihar and Orissa and plantation areas of Assam.

Non-tribal people belonging to different religious faiths migrated mainly from East Bengal and Assam and parts of Bihar and Orissa and began to settle down in Tripura gradually in the pursuit of their livelihood.

According to table XVII of 1931 Census published in Bengali by the Government of the Ruler, the entire population was classified into 93 castes including tribes. According to Tripura State table No. 2 of 1931, the communities of *Puratan Tripura*, *Deshi Tripura*, *Jamatia*, *Riang* and *Noatia* were known under the generic name of *Tripur-Khatriya*. The Tripur Khatriyas returned in 1941 Census was far less than the figures of 1931 Census and this was perhaps due to under enumeration or to the fact that less people returned themselves as Tripur Khatriyas.

The Constitution (Scheduled Castes) (Part C States) Order, 1951 contained names of 36 Scheduled Castes of Tripura in Part IX of the Schedule to the Order.

According to Article 366 (24) of the Constitution, 'Scheduled Castes' means such castes, races or tribes or parts of or groups within such castes, races or tribes as are deemed under Article 341 to be Scheduled Castes for the purposes of the Constitution.

The Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) (Part C States) Order, 1951 contained names of 18 Scheduled Tribes of Tripura in Part VII of the Schedule to the Order.

According to Article 366 (25) of the Constitution, 'Scheduled Tribes', means such tribes or tribal communities or parts of or groups within such tribes or tribal communities as are deemed under Article 342 to be Scheduled Tribes for the purpose of the Constitution.

Population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Tripura in 1951 :-

- (a) Scheduled Castes 46,371
- (b) Scheduled Tribes 192,293

Population of individual Tribes in Tripura are given in Miscellaneous Table No. 1 of the Census Hand Book of 1951. There is no table showing population by Scheduled Castes in Tripura for 1951.

The Constitution (Scheduled Castes) (Part C States) Order, 1951

The Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) (Part C States) Order, 1951 have been amended by the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Lists (Modification) Order, 1956, according to which the enumeration of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes has been conducted in 1961 Census in Tripura. The modified lists appearing in the Schedule to the amended order are reproduced below :- They apply throughout the territory and except this, there is no area restriction in the President's Order.

By 1956 Order mentioned above, the modification effected in the 1951 List of Scheduled Castes are (i) classification of *Muchi* with that of *Chamar* and (ii) inclusion of the castes of *Kanda* and *Musahar*.

The 1951 List of Scheduled Tribes has been modified by inclusion of :-

- i) sub-tribes of *Kuki*,
- ii) Synonyms for the tribe Tripura, and
- iii) the tribe *Uchai*

The names of sub-tribes of Kuki are given at page 87 of the Census Report in Bengali published by then Government of the Ruler. The name of sub-tribe Hajango appearing in the Modification Order of 1956 is not mentioned therein. The names of sub-tribes of Halam are given at page 81 of the same Report in the *foot note* in which it has been recorded that *Chhaimal*, although treated as a sub-tribe of Halam for purposes of 1931 Census, is actually a sub-tribe of Kuki, and that *Murdhakanj* or *Murasing*, although treated as a sub-tribe of Halam for purposes of 1931 Census, is actually a sub-tribe of Noatia. The names of *Rangkhole* and *Khephong* (Kaipang) appear as sub-tribes of Halam at page 81 of the Census Report of 1931 referred to above. But these two sub-tribes are included among the sub-tribes of Kuki in the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes List (Modification) Order, 1956.

Separate figures for the two sub-tribes of Rangkhole and Khephong of 1961 Census have however, been compiled and shown in the appropriate fly-leaves to tables of this Part for facility of reference.

Population figures for individual Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe are often required and at present they are available only for some of them in the 1931 and later Census Tables. At the 1951 Census there were no special tables for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes except Table D. III giving the total number of persons belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and another table in the Census Hand Book (Miscellaneous table

No. 1) showing population by tribes and their distribution by religion in rural and urban areas. The Constitution has provided special safe-guards for these communities. At the 1961 Census, therefore, special tables have been devised so that the data may be useful to the Government in formulating welfare schemes for the improvement of the conditions of these communities.

The Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes tables are intended for the following characteristics :-

- 1 Industrial classification of workers and non-workers;
- 2 Age and marital status;
- 3 Education;
- 4 Religion;
- 5 Persons not at work classification by sex, type of activity and educational levels of Scheduled Castes;
- 6 Mother-tongue and bi-lingualism for Scheduled Tribes;
- 7 Persons not at work classified by sex and type of activity for Scheduled Tribes.

The instructions for filling up Question 5 (c) in the individual Slip for census enumeration regarding Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, reproduced below :-

"The answers to this question will be recorded

only if a person belongs to a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe. If the person belongs to a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe obtaining in your State, or in your Sub-division, write the name of the caste or tribe to which he belongs. For all others, write 'X' in this column. A list of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes obtaining in the State is given elsewhere in these instructions.

If the person belonging to a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe returns his caste or tribe by a synonym or a generic name of a caste or tribe as given in the lists, write the name as returned and the name of the relevant caste or tribe, as per approved list, within brackets.

Do not write the names of Scheduled Caste in general terms as 'Harijan' 'Achhut'. You should ascertain the name of the caste when it is returned and write it. If a person is negligent and insists on calling himself merely a 'Harijan', tell him that this description will not earn the person any benefits under the Constitution permissible to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. This may persuade him to give out the correct name.

Scheduled Castes can belong only to the Hindu or Sikh religions. If a person belongs to a Scheduled Caste, there will be either 'H' or 'S' in the answer to question 5 (b). Scheduled Tribes may belong to any religion."

This table has been prepared for each Scheduled Caste and for rural and urban population showing the distribution of members of each Scheduled Caste according to Industrial classification of workers and another category of non-workers. In addition it presents data on occupations viz., Tanning & Currying of hides and skins and also scavenging in which the members of Scheduled Castes are at work.

2. The answer to Q. 5 (c) has been recorded in the slip as returned. There is no figure for 'Unclassified Scheduled Castes' since there has been found no return as *Harijan* or *Achhut*.

3. The President's Order in which the Scheduled Castes by name have been recognised as such, applies throughout the territory and there is no area restriction.

4. Workers and Non-Workers :

At the present Census the population has been divided broadly into two section viz., (1) Workers, i.e., all those engaged in some productive work; and (2) Non-workers. The emphasis at this Census is not income or dependence for livelihood but the actual work that a person does. Therefore, the working population irrespective of whether all the workers actually derive income or not, is classified according to the primary economic activity of the workers. The Census enumerator mainly examined what work the person enumerated was doing during the 15 days preceding the day on which the person was enumerated. In respect of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairy, household industry, etc. if the person had some regular work for more than one hour a day, throughout the greater part of the working season, he was recorded as a worker.

If a person was temporarily incapacitated from work at the time of Census enumeration due to illness or other cause he was treated as a worker depending on what he normally did. An under-trial prisoner though in prison during Census enumeration was also treated as a worker if he did some productive work before he was apprehended. But a convict in a prison or long term inmate of hospitals, or mental

institutions was not treated as worker. A person who was merely offered work but actually not joined the work was not treated as a worker. Persons under training as apprentices with or without wages were recorded as worker. Family workers, i.e., who did not directly derive any income but attend to work along with other members of the family were treated as workers. An adult woman who was engaged merely in household duties and did no other productive work was not treated as a worker. Work included not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of work. A public or social service worker who was actually engaged in public service activity or political activity was taken as a worker. Thus all workers in any branch of productive work were treated as workers. These are all broadly classified under nine basic categories namely :

- (i) working as Cultivators;
- (ii) working as Agricultural Labourers;
- (iii) working in Mining, Quarrying, Livestock, Forestry, Fishing, Hunting, Plantations and Orchards and other allied activities;
- (iv) working at Household Industry;
- (v) working in Manufacturing other than Household Industry;
- (vi) working in Construction;
- (vii) working in Trade and Commerce;
- (viii) working in Transport, Storage and Communications; and
- (ix) working in Other Services.

All other who did not do any productive work irrespective of whether they derived some income such as through pensions, rents, etc. or did not derive any income were classified under category X—"Non-Workers". These Non-Workers cover

- (1) full time students,
- (2) a person engaged in unpaid home duties (housewife),
- (3) a dependent, i.e., an infant or child not attending school, a person permanently disabled from working due to illness or old age,

- (4) a retired person not employed again, a rentier or royalty receiver, or any other person of independent means for securing which he does not have to work and does no other work,
- (5) a beggar, a vagrant or an independent woman without indication of source of income,
- (6) a convict in jail or an inmate of penal, mental or charitable institution,
- (7) an unemployed person seeking employment for the first time,
- (8) a person employed before but now out of employment.

5. *Household Industry :*

Household Industry was defined as an industry conducted by the head of the household himself and or mainly members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas, and only at home in urban areas. The industry should not be run on the scale of a registered factory. Thus the main criterion for a household industry was the participa-

tion of one or more members of household in rural areas. In the urban areas the industry should be confined to the house. A household industry should relate to production, processing, servicing, repairing or making and selling of goods. It did not include professions, such as, pleader, doctor, barber, washerman or astrologer.

6. 30% of the Scheduled Castes, that is, only 3% of the total population, are engaged in Agriculture. Except in category III, Namsudra community appears numerically predominant among the Scheduled Castes in all other categories

7. The number of females exceeds their counterparts to a small proportion among Ghasi, Gur, Kahar, Khadit, Koch and Kora.

8. There is no table showing the distribution of population by Scheduled Castes in Tripura at the 1951 Census. Total figures for Scheduled Castes by sex, as presented in table D-III of 1951 Census, stood at 22,924 for males and 23,447 for females. The percentage of Scheduled Castes population to total comes to 7 in 1951 and 10.5 in 1961.

It will be seen from the above statement that there is none in any urban area and the concentration of the two sub-tribes is confined in four sub-divisions only, viz., Sadar, Khowai, Kamalpur and Amarpur. Moreover, the distribution of population of the two sub-tribes according to Industrial classification is spread over only to categories I, II,

IV, V, IX and X. The statement above, therefore, has been abridged to show these Industrial categories only and the rural areas of four sub-divisions only in which they were found.

5. The following statement shows the percentage variation by Scheduled Tribes during 1951-1961 :

6. The unprecedented percentage of increase of tribes shows the extent of under-enumeration made in 1951 Census, probably due to unhappy disturbances prevailing in the hills. The increase cannot reasonably be attributed to the large-scale in-migration from anywhere else of Jamatia, Noatia and Rieng tribes which are branches of Tripur-Kshatriyas, and of Halam tribe. The in-migration of Chakma and Mag from Chittagong Hill tracts and of Lushai from Assam is possible.

7. There is migration trend from Assam also. Total in-migrants from Assam stand at 10,127 in 1961. The percentage increase in respect of Tripuri alone appears normal. The annual growth rate by tribe is not available. Of course, absence of any epidemic or loss of lives due to any natural calamities in the hilly areas during the last decade as also the measures taken by the Government for the improvement of health and sanitation in the territory

have contributed considerably to the raising of the longevity of the people in general.

9. The tribes of Bhutia and Garoo seem to suffer from decreasing in number; but the out-migration statement above shows that the actual position may not be so, because in the four hill districts alone of Assam, total migrants from Tripura come to 4,032. From the 1951 Census Report of Assam, Manipur and Tripura is seen that Garoos are chiefly found in the Garo Hills and Goalpara (*vide* page 418 of Part 1-A of Volume XII). It is probable that Bhutias also, though their number is negligible, have migrated to parts of Assam or any other parts of the country.

10. 46.7% of the Scheduled Tribes, that is, only 14.7% of the total population, are engaged in Agriculture. The proportion of participation in Agriculture of male to female is 9:7. Except in category III, Tripuri tribe appears numerically predominant among the Scheduled Tribes in all other categories. The number of females in the case of Bhil, Chaimal and Lushai tribes exceeds very slightly that of their counterparts.

This demographic table corresponding to table C-II has been prepared for each Scheduled Caste for total and not by rural and urban classification. The age-groups have been restricted to 0—14, 15—44, 45+ and age not stated.

2. This new table is expected to provide scope at the next Census for an assessment of the increase or decrease that will obtain in the proportions of the marital status condition during the next decade.

3. Marital Status

'Never married' : A person who has never been married.

'Married' : A person who is married whether for the first or another time, or a person who is recognised by custom or society as married or a person who is in stable *de facto* union, or if a person says that he or she is married or in stable *de facto* union, even, if the marriage of the person concerned is disputed in the locality.

'Widowed' : A person is so whose husband or wife is dead and who has not been married again.

'Divorced' : A person who has been divorced in a lawful manner, either by decree or a law court or by regular social or religious custom but who has not remarried.

"Separated" : A person who has been separated from wife or husband and is living apart with no apparent intention of living together again.

For a prostitute the instruction was to return her marital status as declared by her.

If in any slip the answer in the relevant question was not recorded, the enumerator was instructed to treat it as of 'Unspecified status'.

4. In the age-group 0-14, the figures for 'married', 'widowed' 'divorced or separated' and 'unspecified status' relate to those in the age-group of 10-14.

5. Early marriage between the ages of 10 and 14 is prevalent among the Scheduled Castes of Bhuimali, Chamar or Muchi, Dhoba, Jalia Kaibarta, Mahisyadas, Mali and Namsudra. There is no male widowed, divorced/separated of this age in any caste; on the other hand there are a few females of this age who are widows and are either divorced or separated.

6. The proportion of married woman in the caste of Mehtor is less than that of their counterpart in the age-group of 15-44, while in the age-group of 45+ the number of never-married among them is nil. Migration of never-married women of this caste to other State in connection with their marriage is possible.

1. This demographic table corresponding to table C-II has also been prepared for each Scheduled Tribe for total and not for rural and urban classifications. The age-groups, as in Part A of this table, have been restricted to 0-14, 15-44, 45+ and age not stated.

2. This new table will provide scope at the next Census for an assessment of the increase or decrease that will be obtained in the proportions for the marital status condition of each Scheduled Tribe during the next decade.

3. The different marital status conditions have been explained in the fly-leaf to table SCT-II Part A.

4. In the age-group 0-14, the figures for 'married', 'widowed', 'divorced or separated' and 'unspecified status' relate to those in the age-group of 10-14.

5. The statement appearing on page 248-249 shows the age and marital status of the Sub-tribes of 'Khephong' and 'Rangkhole'.

6. Instances of early marriages in the ages

between 10 and 14 is noticeable among the Scheduled Tribes of Chakma, Garoo, Jamatia' Mag, Noatia, Riang and Tripuri. There are widows among Riang and Tripuri in this age-group. Cases of divorced/separated in this age group are also there.

7. The proportion of males who are divorced or separated in the age-group of 15-44 is generally higher in all the tribes than their counterparts. The figures for widowed of this age-group show the higher rate of female mortality among the tribes, but the position is quite the reverse in the age group of 45+ where male mortality is much higher in each Tribe.

8. The number of females is more than of males among the Lushai Tribes.

9. There is no case of early marriage in the ages between 10 and 14 among the Lushai and the tribes of Bhil, Chhaimal, khasia and Uchai.

10. The statement appearing on page 250 shows the age and marital status conditions for total population classified by Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and others in abstract figures and percentages to total males and total females.

2. *Explanatory Note* on 'Literacy and Education' :—

(1) *Illiterate* is a person who can neither read nor write or can merely read out but cannot write in any language.

(2) *Literate* is a person who can both read and write.

The test for reading is ability to read any simple letter either in print or in manuscript i.e., if the person can read one of the examples in the Enumerator's Hand Book with facility he may be taken to have passed the test for reading. The test for writing is ability to write a simple letter. The test for literacy is satisfied if the person can with understanding both read and write.

All Children aged 4 and below has been treated as illiterate, even though they are full time students.

(3) If the person can both read and write and has also passed a written examination or examinations as proof of an educational standard attained, the highest examination passed have been written.

3. The table shows that education is being encouraged among Chamar or Muchi, Dum and Mehtar in urban areas.

4. No caste other than Jaila Kaibarta, Mahisyadas and Namsudra, has so far taken any University degree/diploma.

5. Literacy of Scheduled Castes in urban areas to total Scheduled Castes stands at 23.66%, of which the percentage of males stands at 18.40% and that of females at 5.26% only.

1. This table has been prepared for total/rural/urban for total members of Scheduled Castes who are not at work. Each educational category, viz., illiterate, literate (without educational level), Primary or Junior Basic, Matriculation or Higher Secondary and above Matriculation or Higher Secondary has been classified into three important types of activity of non-workers viz., 'Full time students', 'Persons seeking employment for the first time' and 'Unemployed but seeking work.' The group for 'Others' includes the remaining types of activity of non-workers such as:—

- (a) A person engaged in unpaid home duties (like housewife or other adult female) who does no other work, such as make articles at home for sale or wages, nor help regularly even part-time in family cultivation, industry, trade or business;
- (b) a dependent, including an infant or child not attending school, a person permanently disabled from work because of illness or old age;
- (c) a retired person who is not employed again, rentier, person living on agricultural, non-agricultural royalty, rent or dividend or any other person of independent means for securing which he does not have to work and who does no other work;

- (d) a beggar, vagrant, or independent woman without indication of source of income and others of unspecified source of existence;
- (e) a convict in jail (an under-trial prisoner has been shown as a worker if he used to work before he was apprehended.) or an inmate of a penal, mental, or charitable institution.

2. Illiterates under column 'Full time students', are those who cannot read and write in regional language with felicity but attending schools, Balwaris or Social Education Centres etc.

3. There are 12 males whose educational qualifications are either Matriculation or above, out of a total of 77,434 persons, who have returned themselves as seeking employment. There is, therefore, practically no problem of educated unemployment among the Scheduled Caste population.

4. In this table the number of female 'full time students' stands at 2,270. But in tables SCT-III. Part A (i) and SCT-III Part B (i), the total number of literate females among the Scheduled Castes comes to 1,733. The comparative decrease in the literate figure for female is due to the fact that beginners attending schools did not stand the test of literacy although they were full time students and such students have been treated as illiterates.

1. This table which is similar to table C-VI has been prepared for total for each Scheduled Tribe giving the speakers of each tribe in mother-tongues and also the number of persons by sex using a subsidiary language which they can use with felicity in communicating with others.

2. The table has been prepared by sorting slips of each Scheduled Tribe with reference to the mother-tongue recorded in Q. 7 (a) and subsidiary language recorded in Q. 7 (b) in the slip. The instructions for filling up answers to these questions are reproduced below :—

“Q. 7 (a) Mother Tongue :

Write the mother-tongue in full including dialect as returned by the person enumerated. Mother-tongue is language spoken in childhood by the person's mother to the person or mainly spoken in the household. If the mother died in infancy write the language mostly spoken in the person's home in childhood. In the case of infants and deaf mutes give the language usually spoken by the mother.

Q 7 (b)—Any Other Language :

After recording the mother-tongue enquire whether the person knows any other language (s), Indian or Foreign, and write the language (s) returned by him against this question. In case he does not know any other language, Put 'X'.

The number of languages recorded against this question should not be more than two. These languages should be other than his mother-tongue which he speaks and understands best and can use with felicity in communicating with others. Such language or languages will exclude dialects of the same language.

The number of female 'full time students' stands at 4,135, while in tables SCT-III Part A (ii) and SCT-III. Part B (ii) the figure of literate females (without educational level) comes to 2,878 only. The reason for this comparative drop in the number of literate females is that the beginners attending schools did not stand the test of literacy though they were students, and therefore, such girls have been

treated as illiterates.

The total number of un-employed persons of all Tribes comes to 179 only, out of a total non-working population of 174,323. Compared by tribes, the maximum number of unemployed belong to the tribe, Tripuri, (whether in seeking work for the first time or now unemployed but seeking work) particularly in Sadar Sub-division.
