Notes.—

- (1) In December, 1954, the Government of India announced that in view of the fall in the prices of some foodgrains to unduly low levels in some isolated areas, they would be prepared to purchase from cultivators as a measure of relief, jowar at Rs. 5.50 per maund or Rs. 14.74 per quintal, bajra at Rs. 6.00 per maund or Rs. 16.06 per quintal and maize at Rs. 5.50 per maund or Rs. 14.74 per quintal at certain specified mandis where the prices fell below these levels. The policy of limited price support was extended to wheat in March, 1955, when the Government announced that they would make purchases of F.A.Q. wheat at rail-head mandis at Rs. 10.00 per maund or Rs. 26.80 per quintal where its price fell below that level. In June, 1955, a minimum purchase price of Rs. 6.00 per maund or Rs. 16.06 per quintal was announced for gram, the machinery for the purchase of gram being the same as that for wheat. In August, 1955 the Government announced its decision to make purchases of coarse rice, as a measure of price support at selected mandis if the price of that quality fell below Rs. 11.00 per maund or Rs. 29.47 per quintal.
- (2) The limited price support policy for jowar, bajra and maize was extended in September, 1955 to the 1955-56 Kharif crop when the Government of India announced the same minimum prices for these grains as were in force in 1954-55.
- (3) No purchases of bajra and coarse rice were made during 1955 as the market prices of these cereals did not fall below the minimum prices announced by the Government.
- (4) No purchases of cereals were made during 1956 on Government of India's account. A quantity of 20,847 tonnes of rice and 1,588 tonnes of paddy was, however, purchased through trade on Jammu & Kashmir Government's account and despatched direct to Pathankot.
- (5) In pursuance of their policy to assure a reasonable price to the cultivator for his produce, the Government of India introduced in March, 1962, a scheme to give support to the prices of wheat in the event of their going down to uneconomic levels. The following minimum prices of wheat were fixed :

Purchasing agents were appointed in mandis where the State Governments considered that there was a likelihood of the prices of wheat falling below the support prices. Prices of wheat, however, stabilised at suitable levels very soon after the harvest and it was not necessary for the Government of India to purchase any large quantity of wheat.

(6) For rice, it was decided not to fix any minimum support price. Wherever Government procurement of rice was in operation, the procurement prices acted as support prices. In other States, the State Governments were advised to purchase the common white varieties of rice at prices fixed during the 1958-59 season if prices in any area tended to fall below those levels after the harvest. It was expected that if the prices of common white varieties of rice stabilised at suitable levels, the prices of other varieties would also stabilise at comparable levels.

(7) For the 1963-64 wheat season, it was decided to make purchases of wheat as a measure of price support in major wheat producing States viz., Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab and Rajasthan. It was arranged with the Governments of the above four States that they would purchase wheat on behalf of the Central Government as and when prices of any quality of wheat touched or fell below the minimum level fixed by the Government of India anywhere in the States. The following support prices were announced on 26th April, 1963 :

(8) In December, 1962, the price support scheme was extended to rice. In the States where Government were procuring rice, the procurement prices acted as support prices. In other States the State Governments were advised to purchase common white varieties of rice of fair average quality at prices ranging between Rs. 40·19 and Rs. 44·21 per quintal (Rs. 15·00 & Rs. 16·50 per maund) if the prices of rice tended to fall below these levels. It was expected that if the prices of common white varieties of rice stabilised at suitable levels, the prices of other varieties would also stabilise at comparable levels. In view of the decline in production of rice during 1962-63, the prices of rice ruled at higher levels and there was no actual purchase of rice as a price support measure.

(9) No minimum prices for paddy were fixed for 1962-63 season as it was expected that by giving support to the prices of rice, the prices of paddy would automatically stabilise at suitable levels.

(10) For the 1963-64 season, the price support scheme has been extended to jowar and the following support prices have been fixed :

As jowar is produced mainly for local consumption and inter-State movement of this grain is very small the Governments of major jowar producing States have been advised to purchase jowar under their own arrangements and to make suitable arrangements for its storage and subsequent disposal. They have also been requested to utilise the agency of co-operatives to the extent feasible. No purchases of jowar have, however, been made under this scheme.

For the season 1967-68, the minimum price of sugarcane was revised from Rs. 5.68 per quintal to Rs. 7.37 per quintal. The linkage with recovery at 9.4% was maintained, but the premium for higher recoveries was raised from 4 paise per quintal to 5.36 paise per quintal for every increase of 0.1% in recovery above 9.4%. The minimum price for sugarcane delivered at the cane purchasing Centre connected by rail was 32 paise per quintal less than the price fixed for delivery at the factory gate. Similarly a rebate at the rate of 2.5 paise per quintal per kilometre was allowed to be deducted from the cane price in the case of sugarcane delivered at the cane purchasing centre connected by road if such cane was transported by the sugar factory at its own cost. This rebate was also subject to a maximum of 32 paise per quintal. The Govt. of India have decided that no change will be made in the minimum price of sugarcane during the crushing year 1968-69.

APPENDIX I

Important Food Control Measures for the Year 1968

I. MOVEMENT RESTRICTIONS

A. General

1. Wheat Zones

- March, 1968 The Inter-Zonal Wheat and Wheat Products (Movement Control) Second Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 28-3-1968 whereby a single State zone of wheat comprising the States of Punjab, Haryana, J. & K. and the Union Territories of Himachal Pradesh, Delhi and Chandigarh was constituted.
- April, 1968 The Inter-Zonal Wheat and Wheat Products (Movement Control) Third Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 25-4-68 so as to assume the powers to issue permits for export or import of (i) seed wheat for bonafide agricultural purposes or (ii) wheat produced on land owned or cultivated by a person for domestic consumption at his place of residence.
- May, 1968 The Inter-Zonal Wheat and Wheat Products (Movement Control) Fourth Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 20-5-68 whereby the expression "wheat" was redefined to include split wheat and any mixture of wheat and (i) gram or barley in which the proportion of wheat exceeds four per cent, or (ii) and other foodgrains in which the proportion of wheat exceeds two per cent.
- July, 1968 The Inter-Zonal Wheat and Wheat Products (Movement Control) Fifth Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 3-7-1968 whereby movement of wheat and wheat products was made free to Shahdara Market which is in the border area of the Union Territory of Delhi from any place within Zone I comprising the States of Punjab, Haryana and the Union Territories of Delhi, Himachal Pradesh and Chandigarh.
- August, 1968 The Inter-Zonal Wheat and Wheat Products (Movement Control) Sixth Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 7-8-1968 so as to make movement of wheat free to any place in zonal border area in Haryana from any other place in zonal border area in Haryana or from any place within Zone I, consisting of the States of Punjab and Haryana and the Union Territories of Chandigarh, Delhi and Himachal Pradesh.
- January, 1969 The Inter-Zonal Wheat and Wheat Products (Movement Control) Amendment Order, 1969 was issued by the Central Government on 13-1-1969 whereby movement of wheat and wheat products was made free from Uttar Pradesh (Zone II) to any place in the Union Territory of Delhi but not vice-versa.

2. Rice Zones

- March, 1968 Rice Northern Inter-Zonal (Movement Control) Order, 1967 was repealed with the issue of the Northern Rice Zone (Movement Control) Order, 1968 w.e.f. 28-3-1968.
- October, 1968 The Punjab and Haryana Paddy (Regulation of Movement) Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 17-10-1968 whereby the movement of paddy from the States of Punjab and Haryana was regulated with effect from that date.
- December, 1968 The Orissa Rice (Movement Control) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 5-12-68 whereby the definition of 'Border Area' was amended as area inside the State of Orissa falling within a sixteen kilometres belt all along the border of the State.

3. Gram Zone

- March, 1968 The Northern Inter-Zonal Gram (Movement Control) Order 1967 was rescinded by the Central Government on 28-3-68.

4. Maize Zone

- January, 1968 The Northern-Inter-Zonal Maize (Movement Control) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 19-1-68 whereby compounded cattle feeds (No. IS 2052) and Poultry feeds (No. IS 1374) were exempted from the operation of the Order.
- March, 1968 The Northern-Inter-Zonal Maize (Movement Control) Order, 1968 was rescinded by the Central Government on 23-8-68.

5. Miscellaneous

- February, 1968 The Foodgrains Movement Restrictions (Exemption of Certified Seeds) Amendment Order 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 13-2-68 whereby seeds certified as such by the Indian Agricultural Research Institute were exempted from the operation of the movement restrictions imposed under the orders and specified in the Schedule of the Foodgrains Movement Restrictions (Exemption of Certified Seeds) Order, 1968.

- May, 1968 The Foodgrains Movement Restrictions (Exemption of Certified Seeds) Second Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 30-5-68 whereby seeds certified as such by the Central State Farm Suratgarh were exempted from the operation of the movement restrictions imposed under the orders specified in the Schedule of the Foodgrains Movement Restrictions (Exemption of Certified Seeds) Order, 1966.
- November, 1968 The Foodgrains Movement Restrictions (Exemption of Certified Seeds) Third Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 11-11-68 whereby seeds other than certified seeds in terms of the definition contained in the Order could also be exempted from the operation of movement restrictions provided that such movement is authorised by the Central Government or by a State Government with the approval of the Central Government.
- June, 1968 Foodgrains Movement Restrictions (Exemption to Food Corporation of India) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 15-6-68.

B. States

Bihar

- April, 1968 The notification of the Bihar Government restricting of movement of maize and gram by road or river from one place to another in Bihar was amended by the State Government omitting the word 'Gram' from the operation of the Order.
- Gujarat
- March, 1968 The Gujarat Gram (Export Control) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the Central Government on 28-3-68.
- October, 1968 The Gujarat Paddy (Procurement) Order, 1968 was repealed by the State Government with the issue of the Gujarat Paddy (Procurement) Order, 1968 w.e.f. 19-10-68.
- November, 1968 The Gujarat Paddy (Procurement) Order, 1968 was amended by the State Government on 13-11-68 whereby definition of "Irrigated land" was changed.

Haryana

- March, 1968 The Punjab Coarse Grains (Export Control) Order, 1966 which was extended to the Haryana State was rescinded by the Central Government on 28-3-68.

Kerala

- February, 1968 The Kerala Rice (Regulation of Movement) Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 22-2-68 thereby redefining the expression "rice".

Madhya Pradesh

- January, 1968 The Madhya Pradesh Foodgrains (Restrictions on Transport by Road and Water) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the State Government on 27-1-68. The Madhya Pradesh Foodgrains (Restrictions on Transport by Rail) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the State Government on 27-1-68.
- March, 1968 The Madhya Pradesh Gram (Export Control) Order, 1967 and the Madhya Pradesh Barley (Export Control) Order, 1967 were rescinded by the Central Government w.e.f. 28-3-68.
- April, 1968 The Madhya Pradesh Foodgrains (Restrictions on Border Transport) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 1-4-68, whereby, movement of gram and barley was made free.

Madras

- March, 1968 The Madras Gram (Export Control) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the Central Government on 28-3-68.
- April, 1968 The Madras Paddy and Rice (Movement Control) Second Order was repealed by the State Government w.e.f. 11-4-68 with the issue of the Madras Paddy and Rice (Movement Control) Order, 1968.

Mysore

- March, 1968 The Mysore Foodgrains (Regulation of Export) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 28-3-68 whereby the movement of gram to places outside Mysore was made free.
- April, 1968 The Mysore Foodgrains (Regulation of Export) Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 24-4-68 whereby the officer known as Sheristedar was substituted for a Deputy Tehsildar for the purpose of powers for entry, search and seizure.
- January, 1969 The Mysore Foodgrains (Regulation of Export) Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 17-1-69 whereby the movement of bajra and maize to places outside Mysore was made free.

Orissa

- December, 1968 The Orissa Rice (Movement Control) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 5-12-68 whereby the border belt was expanded to cover the entire border of the State to a depth of 16 kilometres.

Rajasthan

- March, 1968 The Rajasthan Gram and Barley (Prohibition of Export) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the Central Government on 28-3-68.
The Rajasthan Coarse Grains (Prohibition of Export) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the Central Government on 28-3-68.
- September, 1968 The Rajasthan Coarse Grains (Prohibition of Movement) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 28-9-68 whereby the movement of maize, bajra and jowar to places outside the State of Rajasthan was restricted.
- October, 1968 The Rajasthan Foodgrains (Restrictions on Border Movement) Second Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 17-10-68 whereby the movement of maize, bajra and jowar to and within the border area was restricted.

Uttar Pradesh

- March, 1968 The Uttar Pradesh Jowar (Levy) Order, 1968 was rescinded by the State Government w.e.f. 12-2-68.
- December, 1968 The Uttar Pradesh Foodgrains (Movement Control) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the State Government on 19-12-68.

West Bengal

- November, 1967 The Government of West Bengal issued the West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Restriction on Movement) Order, 1967 on 10-11-67 whereby restrictions were imposed on transport of Rice and Paddy from any place within the State and to any place outside the State.
- January, 1968 The West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Restrictions on Movement by Night) Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 8-1-68 whereby clauses 4 and 5 of the West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Restriction on Movement by Night) Order, 1967 pertaining to the powers of entry, search and seizure etc. were deleted.
- April, 1968 The West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Restrictions on Movement) Order, 1967 was repealed by the State Government with the issue of the West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Restrictions on Movement) Order, 1968 w.e.f. 24-4-68.
- August, 1968 The West Bengal Rice (Movement Control) Second Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 20-8-68 whereby import of 2 kilograms of rice by a bona-fide traveller to any place where the West Bengal Rationing Order, 1964 is in force and 5 kilograms to any other place was allowed.
- November, 1968 The West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Restrictions on Movement) Order, 1968 was amended by the State Government on 23-11-68 imposing restrictions on transport of rice and paddy in the districts of Birbhum, Bankura, Purulia and West DinaJPur excluding Asansol and Durgapur Sub-division.

Delhi

- March, 1968 The Delhi Specified Food Articles (Movement Control) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 28-3-68 whereby the restrictions on movement of wheat, atta, maida, suji, rawa, rice and paddy out of rationed area to other areas of zone were removed.
- April, 1968 The Delhi Coarse Grains (Export Control) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the Central Government on 2-4-68.
- September, 1968 The Delhi Specified Food Articles (Movement Control) Second Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 21-9-68 whereby the designation of the Chief Controller of Rationing Delhi was changed to Commissioner of Food & Supplies Delhi.

Manipur

- June, 1968 The Manipur Foodgrains (Movement Control) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 15-6-68, whereby maize and its products were omitted from the purview of the Order.

- March, 1968 The Andhra Pradesh Rice (Procurement Ex-mill Prices) Order, 1967 and the Andhra Pradesh Paddy (Procurement Prices) Order, 1967 were amended by the State Government on 12-3-68 whereby the procurement prices of S.L.O. 16 and Muvvabannom varieties of rice and paddy were fixed. The Andhra Pradesh Rice (Ex-mill Procurement Prices) Order 1967 and the A.P. Paddy (Procurement Prices) Order, 1967 were further amended on 21-3-68 by the State Government whereby the Procurement Prices of certain other fine and coarse varieties of rice and paddy were fixed statutorily.
- April, 1968 The Andhra Pradesh Rice (Ex-mill Procurement) Prices Order, 1967 and the Andhra Pradesh Paddy (Procurement) Prices Order, 1967 were amended by the State Government on 3-4-68 whereby, procurement prices of C.U. 29, S.L.O. 16 and Muvvabannom as fine and Muga, Sonnai and Garikulu as coarse varieties of paddy and rice were brought under the Procurement Prices Control Orders and their procurement prices fixed.
- The Andhra Pradesh Coarse Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1964 was rescinded by the Central Government on 6-4-68.
- June, 1968 The Andhra Pradesh Rice (Procurement Ex-mill Prices) Order, 1967 and the Andhra Pradesh Paddy (Procurement Prices) Order, 1967 were amended by the State Government on 17-6-68 whereby the procurement prices of Ragolu-1 and H.R. 12, Rajahamsalu varieties of rice and paddy were fixed statutorily.

Bihar

- March, 1968 The Bihar Roller Mills Wheat Products (Price Control) Order, 1969 was issued by the Central Government on 3-3-68 whereby the ex-mill prices of Wheat Products were fixed.

Gujarat

- October, 1968 The Government of Gujarat issued the Gujarat Padd. (Procurement) Order 1968 on 19-10-68 repealing thereby the Gujarat Paddy (Procurement) Order, 1967.
- November, 1968 The Gujarat Paddy (Procurement) Order, 1968 was amended by the State Government on 13-11-68 whereby the definition of "irrigated land" was changed and redefined as land irrigated from any source including tank, tubewells, canals, river and land on which fruit trees are grown.

Haryana

- February, 1968 The Punjab Rice Price Control (Haryana First Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the Haryana Government on 16-2-68 whereby the maximum wholesale and retail prices of rice were reduced.
- May, 1968 The Punjab Rice Price Control (Haryana First Amendment) Order, 1968 was repealed by the Haryana Government on 3-5-68 with the issue of the Haryana Rice Procurement Price Control Order, 1968.
- October, 1968 The Haryana Rice Procurement Price Control Order, 1968 was repealed by the State Government on 17-10-68 with the issue of the Haryana Rice Procurement Price Control Order, 1968.
- December, 1968 The Haryana Rice Procurement Price Control (First Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 23-12-68 whereby tolerance limit of impurities in respect of broken rice was fixed.

Kerala

- April, 1968 The Kerala Paddy (Maximum Prices) Order, 1965 was repealed by the Kerala Government on 1-4-68 with the issue of the Kerala Paddy (Maximum Price) Order, 1968. The Kerala Rice (Maximum Price) Order, 1965 was repealed by the State Government on 1-4-68 with the issue of the Kerala Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1968.

Madhya Pradesh

- April, 1968 The Madhya Pradesh Wheat Procurement (Levy) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 6-4-68 whereby every licensed dealer shall sell to the State Government 50% of the quantity of wheat held in stock.

January, 1969

- The Madhya Pradesh Rice Procurement (Levy) Order, 1960 was amended by the Central Government on 6-1-69 whereby Food Corporation of India was appointed as the Purchase Officer for all Rice Mills other than those run by registered cooperative societies and the State Government was authorised to appoint any authority as Purchase Officer for Co-operative Mills.

Madras

April, 1968

- The Madras Coarse Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1964 was rescinded by the Central Government on 6-4-68. The Madras Paddy (Maximum Prices) Order, 1966 and the Madras Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1966 were amended by the State Government on 11-4-68 whereby Chithadian variety of paddy and rice was brought under the Price Control Orders.

The Madras Cholam and Ragi (Maximum Prices) Order, 1965 was rescinded by the State Government on 25-4-68.

May, 1968

- The Madras Paddy (Maximum Price) Order, 1966 and the Madras Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1966 were amended by the State Government on 31-5-1968 whereby a clause was inserted in the Orders regarding margins admissible towards transport charges, commission and other incidentals.

July, 1968

- The Madras Paddy (Maximum Prices) Order, 1966 and the Madras Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1966 were amended by the State Government on 18-7-68 whereby 'Basangi' variety of paddy and rice was also brought under the Price Control Orders.

September, 1968

- The Madras Paddy (Maximum Prices) Order, 1966 and the Madras Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1966 were amended by the State Government on 9-9-68, whereby fine and coarse varieties of paddy and rice were also brought under the Price Control. Molagolusulu T.K.M.-6 Samb Ari Rani Samba as fine and Basangi and Taichung as coarse varieties of paddy and rice were brought under the Price Control Order.

November, 1968

- The Madras Paddy (Maximum Prices) Order, 1968 and the Madras Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1968 were amended by the State Government on 13-11-1968 whereby Tainan, I.R. 8 variety was brought under the Price Control Orders.

Maharashtra

September, 1968

- The Maharashtra Foodgrains Restrictions (Exemptions of Food Corporation of India) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 10-9-68, whereby F.C.I. was exempted from the Movement Control Orders in force in the Maharashtra State.

November, 1968

- The Maharashtra Scheduled Foodgrains (Stocks Declaration and Procurement and Disposal, Acquisition, Transport and Price Control) Order, 1966, was extended upto 30-11-69 with the issue of an Order by Maharashtra Government on 29-11-68. The Maharashtra Scheduled Foodgrains (Stocks Declaration and Procurement and Disposal, Acquisition, Transport and Price Control) Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 20-11-68 whereby the prices of superfine, fine, medium, coarse varieties of paddy/rice and also of jowar were enhanced.

Mysore

July, 1968

- The Mysore Foodgrains (Requisitioning of Stocks) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on the 11-7-68 whereby the word 'Sheristadar' was substituted in place of the Deputy Tehsildar.

- The Mysore Paddy Procurement (Levy) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 17-10-68 whereby the purchase price of fine, medium and coarse varieties of paddy was increased.

The Mysore Ragi Procurement (Levy) Order, 1966 was repealed by the State Government on 24-10-68.

The Mysore Paddy Procurement (Levy) Second Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 30-10-68 whereby one new clause empowering the State Government to exempt and to order reduction in quantity of paddy to be sold was added in the Mysore Paddy Procurement (Levy) Order, 1966.

November, 1968

- The Mysore Paddy Procurement (Levy) Third Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 21-11-68 whereby a provision has been made in the Order exempting the grower who holds land upto one acre from the operation of the Mysore Paddy Procurement (Levy) Order, 1966.

January, 1969

- The Mysore Foodgrains (Requisitioning of Stocks) Second Amendment Order, 1968 was issued on 3-1-69 by the State Government whereby the prices of rice and paddy were increased.

Punjab

October, 1968

- The Punjab Rice Price Control Order, 1964 was repealed by the State Government on 22-10-68 with the issue of the Punjab Rice Procurement Price Control Order, 1968.

Rajasthan

- March, 1968 . . . The Rajasthan Kharif Foodgrains Procurement (Levy on Dealers) Order, 1967 was rescinded by the State Government on 29-3-68.
- June, 1968 . . . The Rajasthan Wheat Procurement (Levy on Dealers) Order, 1968 was rescinded by the State Government on 4-6-68.

Uttar Pradesh

- January, 1968 . . . The Uttar Pradesh Paddy Procurement (Levy on Producers) Order, 1967 was rescinded by the State Government on 30-1-1968.
- February, 1968 . . . The Uttar Pradesh Jowar (Levy) Amending Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 5-2-68 whereby two districts, Nainital and Lakhimpur Kheri were brought under the purview of the said Order.
- March, 1968 . . . The Uttar Pradesh Jowar (Levy) Order, 1968 was rescinded by the State Government on 12-3-68.
- November, 1968 . . . The Uttar Pradesh Rice (Levy) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the State Government on 26-11-68 with the issue of the Uttar Pradesh Rice and Paddy (Levy) Order, 1968.
- February, 1969 . . . The Uttar Pradesh Rice and Paddy (Levy) Amendment Order, 1969 was issued by the State Government whereby Schedule III pertaining to admixture /impurities tolerance limit and rate of which cut shall be imposed in respect of Basmati (Superior) rice was changed.

West Bengal

- September, 1967 . . . The West Bengal Foodgrains (Requisitioning) Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 6-9-67 whereby Sub Divisional Officer was excluded from the authority for hearing appeals as originally provided in the Order.
- November, 1967 . . . The West Bengal Foodgrains (Procurement) Order, 1967 was repealed by the State Government on 6-11-67 with the issue of the West Bengal Foodgrains (Procurement) (Levy) Order, 1967.
- January, 1968 . . . The West Bengal Foodgrains Procurement (Levy) Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 20-1-68 whereby clauses 7 and 8 pertaining to powers of entry, search, seizure, etc. of the saving provision of the Orders were deleted.
- The West Bengal Foodgrains (Requisitioning of Stocks) Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 10-1-68 whereby higher allowances to producers for the purpose of seeds were given.
- March, 1968 . . . The West Bengal Foodgrains (Requisitioning of Stocks) Order, 1967 was further amended by the State Government on 18-3-68, whereby more allowances to producers for the purpose of seeds and other agricultural purposes were given.
- The West Bengal Foodgrains Procurement (Levy) Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 27-3-68 whereby amendments in regard to definition of procurement agent, irrigated/non-irrigated land owner of the land were made in the said Orders.
- November, 1968 . . . The West Bengal Paddy Price Control Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 21-11-68, whereby the maximum prices of common, fine and superfine varieties of paddy were fixed.
- The West Bengal Government issued an Order on 30-11-68 whereby procurement prices of IR-8 variety of paddy were fixed.
- The West Bengal Foodgrains Procurement (Levy) Order, 1967 was repealed by the State Government by issuing the West Bengal Foodgrains Procurement (Levy) Order, 1968, on 30-11-68.

- March, 1968 . . . The Delhi Wheat Roller Mills Wheat Products (Ex-mill and Retail) Price Control Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 18-3-68 whereby maximum ex-mill prices of wheat products were revised upwards.
- June, 1968 . . . The Delhi Wheat Roller Mills Wheat Products (Ex-mill and Retail Price Control) Second Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 11-6-68 whereby the maximum ex-mill prices of wheat products were further enhanced.

Pondicherry

- January, 1968 . . . The Pondicherry Mahe Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1965 was amended by the Pondicherry Administration on 11-1-68 whereby the maximum Prices of Mahe Rice were revised.

April, 1968 The Pondicherry Yanam Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1955 was repealed by the Pondicherry Administration on 18-4-68 with the issue of the Pondicherry Yanam Rice (Maximum Prices) Order, 1968.

Goa, Daman & Diu

May, 1968 Goa Government issued a notification on 9-5-68 repealing previous notification No. PDD/CS/290/392/67, dated 4-3-67 regarding fixation of retail prices of bread made out from wheat.

Chandigarh

July, 1968 The Chandigarh Administration issued the Punjab Rice Price Control (First Amendment) Order, 1968 on 15-7-68 whereby maximum prices of rice were fixed.

III. PROCUREMENT, LICENSING AND DISTRIBUTION

A. General

February, 1969 The Wheat Roller Flour Mills (Licensing and Control) Amendment Order, 1969 was issued by the Central Government on 21-2-69 to enable the State Governments to notify the Licensing Authorities and Inspectors for controlling the day to day functioning of the Roller Flour Mills.

B. States

Andhra Pradesh

March, 1968 The Andhra Pradesh Government issued a notification on 21-3-68 ordering whereby purchase of 60% rice and paddy each and 50% other notified foodgrains of daily arrivals by the State Government.

April, 1968 The Andhra Pradesh Rice Procurement (Levy) and Restriction on Sale Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government of Andhra Pradesh on 4-4-68 whereby the procedure of levy from millers and milling quantity limits milled by the millers were changed.

The Andhra Pradesh Rice Procurement (Levy) and Restriction on Sale Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 22-4-68 whereby the definition of "Enforcement Officer" was changed.

The Andhra Pradesh Foodgrains Dealers Licensing Order, 1964 was amended by the State Government on 22-4-68 whereby period of submission of return of stocks was extended from 3 days to 5 days.

May, 1968 The Andhra Pradesh Govt. issued a notification on 22-5-68 exempting thereby the quantity of foodgrains to be given by the cultivator and other persons to the State Government for seed purposes from the purview of the Andhra Pradesh Paddy Procurement (Levy) Order 1967.

June, 1968 The Andhra Pradesh Foodgrains (Procurement) Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 1-6-68 whereby Alir market (Mandi) was included in the purchase centres in the District of Nalgonda.

October, 1968 The Andhra Pradesh Rice Procurement (Levy) and Restriction on Sale Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 21-10-68 whereby the clause of 'milling capacity' in the definition clause was omitted. The rate of levy was also fixed at 80% of total quantity of rice delivered to millers for milling purposes.

December, 1968 The Andhra Pradesh Foodgrains Dealers Licensing Order, 1964 was amended by the State Government on 23-12-68 whereby Gram Panchayats which are running fair price shops were exempted from the purview of the Order.

Assam

August, 1967 The Assam Foodgrains (Licensing and Control) (Third Amendment) Order, 1967 was issued by the State Government on 17-8-67 whereby Form III was substituted by a new form known as Form III(1).

Gujarat

May, 1968 The Gujarat Foodgrains Dealers Licensing Order, 1964 was amended by the State Government on 15-5-68, whereby clauses 4A and 4B and paragraphs 9 and 15 in Form B, and Form D were deleted.

Haryana

March, 1968 The Punjab Rice Dealers Licensing (Haryana First Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 29-3-68 whereby any person producing rice by personal cultivation and storing to the extent of four quintals or more was specified a dealer.

Kerala

- November, 1967 The Kerala Foodgrains Dealers Licensing Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 17-11-67 whereby Form C-I, C-II and C-III were introduced.
- January, 1968 The Kerala Paddy and Rice (Declaration and Requisitioning of Stocks) Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 22-1-68, whereby clause 7 regarding search and seizure, etc. was amended.
- April, 1968 The Kerala Paddy and Rice (Declaration and Requisitioning of Stocks) Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 20-4-68 whereby authorised retail distributors and authorised wholesale distributors were exempted from the purview of the Order.
- July, 1968 The Government of Kerala issued a notification on 10-7-68 fixing thereby the scale of levy in respect of paddy and rice.
- August, 1968 The Kerala Rice and Paddy (Procurement by Levy) Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 7-8-68 whereby the total area of cultivators in different Taluks has also been taken into account for assessment of Levy.

Madhya Pradesh

- September, 1967 The M. P. Foodgrains Dealers Licensing Order, 1965 was amended by the State Government on 9-10-67 whereby Taur, Mung, Masur, Urd, Kodo-Kutki and Teora were also brought under the purview of the Order.
- April, 1968 The M. P. Jowar Procurement (Levy) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 6-4-68 whereby 50% levy was imposed on the licensed dealers.
- The M. P. Control of Distribution of Foodgrains Order, 1967 was amended by the Central Govt. on 19-4-68, whereby pulses were omitted from the purview of the Order.
- November, 1968 The M. P. Jowar Procurement (Levy) (First Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 20-11-68 whereby Schedule II pertaining to specifications was changed.

Madras

- November, 1968 The Government of Madras issued two fresh Orders on 12-11-68 known as (1) The Madras Paddy & Rice Dealers (Licensing & Regulation) Order, 1968 and (2) Madras Foodgrains Dealers Licensing Order, 1968 whereby two Orders known as (i) The Madras Paddy and Rice Dealers (Licensing and Regulation) Order, 1968 and (ii) The Madras Foodgrains Dealers Licensing Order, 1968 were repealed.

Maharashtra

- May, 1968 The Maharashtra Foodgrains Dealers Licensing (Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 15-5-68 whereby the Millet, Ragi Kodo was included in Schedule I of the said Order.
- July, 1968 The Maharashtra Foodgrains Dealers Licensing (Second Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 31-7-68 whereby the State Government removed gram from the purview of the licensing control.
- October, 1968 The Maharashtra Poha and Kurmura (Restriction on Manufacture) (Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 29-10-68, whereby the validity of the Order was extended upto 30-11-69.

Rajasthan

- January, 1968 The Rajasthan Wheat Procurement (Levy on Producers) Order, 1967 was rescinded by the State Government on 5-1-1968.
- March, 1968 The Rajasthan Kharif Foodgrains Procurement (Levy on Dealers) Order, 1968 was rescinded by the State Government on 29-3-68.
- May, 1968 The Rajasthan Wheat Procurement (Levy on Dealers) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 4-5-68, whereby 25% levy was imposed on every dealer.
- June, 1968 The Rajasthan Wheat Procurement (Levy on Dealers) Order, 1968 was rescinded by the State Government on 4-6-68.

Uttar Pradesh

- February, 1968 The Uttar Pradesh Foodgrains (Restrictions on Hoarding) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 14-2-68, where storage of foodgrains in a godown of the Central Warehousing Corporation or the State Warehousing Corporation or a Co-operative Warehousing Society was exempted from the purview of the Order.
- March, 1968 The Uttar Pradesh Jowar (Levy) Order, 1968 was rescinded by the State Government on 12-3-68.
- April, 1968 The Uttar Pradesh Foodgrains (Restrictions on Hoarding) (Second Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 10-4-68 whereby coarse grains were excluded from the purview of the Order.
- June, 1968 The Uttar Pradesh Foodgrains (Restrictions on Hoarding) (Third Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 15-6-68, whereby wheat was excluded from the purview of the Order.

- July, 1968 • • • The Uttar Pradesh Flour Mills Licensing (Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 24-7-68 directing thereby that no owner or person in charge of a flour mill can grind or store for grinding in the flour mill any foodgrains without obtaining permission from the District Magistrate.
- August, 1968 • • • The Uttar Pradesh Flour Mills Licensing (Second Amendment) Order was issued by the State Government on 14-8-68 wherein the definition of Flour Mill was modified to make distinction between a Flour Mill and a Roller Mill.
- The Uttar Pradesh Foodgrains Dealers Licensing (Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 27-8-68 whereby Commission Agents engaged in the business of purchase, sale or storage were included in the definition of Dealers.
- November, 1968 • • • The Uttar Pradesh Rice (Levy) Order, 1966 was repealed by the State Government on 26-11-68 with the issue of the Uttar Pradesh Rice and Paddy (Levy) Order, 1968.
- December, 1968 • • • The U. P. Foodgrains Licensing (Second Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 31-12-68 whereby a provision was made to ensure that foodgrains stored are maintained in proper condition.

West Bengal

- November, 1967 • • • By a notification issued on 13-11-67, the West Bengal Government exempted all educational, charitable and religious institutions from the purview of the West Bengal Aus and Boro (Procurement) Order, 1967.
- December, 1967 • • • The State Government issued Essential Foodstuffs Anti-Hoarding Order, 1966 on 30-12-67 whereby Form A(1) for issue of permits to import foodstuffs was amended.
- April, 1968 • • • The West Bengal Husking Machine (Control of Operational) Order, 1968 was amended by the Central Government on 1-4-68 whereby the facility for a permit or a written authority by the officer of the State Government for milling of paddy within the stipulated distance along the border of any district in the State out of paddy grown on any land within such distance was provided.
- November, 1968 • • • The West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Licensing and Control) Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 19-11-68 whereby storage limit was increased from 200 quintals to 250 quintals.
- December, 1968 • • • The West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Licensing and Control) Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 26-12-68, whereby, clauses 7 & 8 of the aforesaid Order were amended.
- February, 1969 • • • The West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Licensing and Control) Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 19-2-69 whereby, Joint Block Development Officer was also authorised to issue registration certificates under said Order.

Delhi

- November, 1967 • • • The Delhi Foodgrains Dealers Licensing (No. 2) (Fourth Amendment) Order, 1967 was issued by the Delhi Administration on 21-11-67, whereby, pulses were included in the Delhi Foodgrains Dealers Licensing (No. 2) Order, 1964.
- January, 1968 • • • The Delhi Foodgrains Dealers Licensing (No. 2) (Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the Delhi Administration on 24-1-68 whereby definition of a dealer was changed.
- May, 1968 • • • The Delhi Foodgrains (Declaration and Disposal of Produce) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the Delhi Administration on 10-5-68.
- August, 1968 • • • The Delhi Prevention of Hoarding of Foodgrains (Amendment) Order, 1968 was issued by the Delhi Administration on 29-8-68, whereby, Commissioner of Food and Supplies of Delhi Administration was empowered to perform all or any functions under the aforesaid Order.

IV. AUSTERITY MEASURES IN FORCE

Andhra Pradesh

The Andhra Pradesh Guest Control Order and the Andhra Pradesh Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order were revised on 4-4-1968. According to the revised Orders the maximum number of participants allowed in ordinary parties is 50 and on the occasions of marriages and funerals 150. Maximum number of courses allowed to be served at meals is 4.

Assam

The Assam Government removed all restrictions on the consumption of foodgrains with effect from 18-12-68.

Bihar

The Bihar (Limitation of Guests) Order and the Bihar Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments), Order were revised on 13-5-68. Thereby restrictions have been imposed on service or distribution for consumption of sweets and all food-stuffs prepared from or containing cereals or pulses. According to the revised Orders the maximum number of participants allowed in ordinary parties is 50 and at marriages and funerals 150 (including the host or hosts). Maximum number of courses allowed at meals is 4. Eatables prepared from cereals other than gram and its products are banned after 3 p.m. on Sundays. Supply of rice or any preparation thereof for consumption is prohibited on Thursdays.

Gujarat

The Gujarat Guest Control Order of 1965 was amended on 13-2-68. Maximum number of participants allowed at ordinary parties including hosts is 50 and in connection with marriages 100. There is no restriction on number of courses at meals. The Gujarat Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order of 1965 was amended on 13-2-68. Service of rice is banned on Saturdays.

Haryana

The Guest Control Order and the Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order issued by the Punjab Government on the 13-10-65 were revised by the Haryana Government on 6-2-68. According to these, the maximum number of participants allowed at ordinary parties is 50 and at marriages and funerals 150. The maximum number of courses allowed at meals is 4. No sweet preparation is allowed to be served where the number of participants exceeds the limit of 150 and 50 in marriages/funerals and ordinary parties respectively.

Kerala

The revised Kerala Guest Control Order, 1967 which came into force on 7-12-67 has not so far been further revised. Thereby supply for consumption of more than two courses at meals is prohibited. The number of persons allowed to be entertained is fixed at 25 including hosts at ordinary parties and 50 at marriages and funerals.

The revised Kerala Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order, 1967 which came into force on 7-12-67 is still continuing. Thereby restrictions were imposed on the service of more than two courses at meals. Service of rice or any rice preparation is banned after 3 P.M. on Mondays or Thursdays.

Maharashtra

The Maharashtra Guest Control Order and the Maharashtra Food (Service by Catering Establishments) Restriction Order were amended on 31-12-68. Now the maximum number of participants allowed at ordinary parties is 50 and at marriages and funerals 150. There is no limit on the number of non-rice courses to be served at these parties. Only one preparation of rice or rice products can be served at any party. The Catering Establishments are not allowed to serve cereal foods after 3 P.M. on Mondays.

Mysore

The Mysore Guest Control Order and the Mysore Catering Establishments (Restrictions on Service of Meals) Order, 1968 were last amended on 22-8-68, according to which maximum number of participants allowed at ordinary parties is 150 and at marriages and funerals 300.

Maximum number of courses allowed to be served at meals is 4. No sweet preparation can be served where the number of participants exceeds the limit of 150 and 300 in ordinary parties and parties in connection with marriages/funerals respectively.

Orissa

The Orissa Guest Control Order and the Orissa Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order, 1965 were last revised on 8-3-68, according to which the maximum number of participants allowed at ordinary parties is 50 and at marriages and funerals 150. Maximum number of courses allowed at meals is 4. No sweet preparation can be served where the number of participants exceeds the limit of 150 and 50 in the marriage/funeral parties and ordinary parties respectively.

Madras (Tamil Nadu)

The Madras Guest Control Order and the Madras Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order were revised in October, 1968, according to which maximum number of participants allowed at ordinary parties is 50 and at marriages and funerals is 150. Maximum number of courses allowed to be served at meals is 4.

Punjab

The Punjab Government removed all the restrictions on the consumption of foodgrains with effect from 28-3-68.

Madhya Pradesh

The M. P. Guest Control Order and the M. P. Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order issued in 1965 were amended on the 25-3-68. Thereby restrictions have been imposed on service or distribution of sweets and all foodstuffs prepared from or containing cereals or pulses. According to the revised Order the maximum number of participants allowed at ordinary parties is 50 and at marriages and funerals 150. The maximum number of courses allowed to be served at meals is 4.

Rajasthan

The Rajasthan Guest Control Order and the Rajasthan Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order, 1965 which were last amended in January, 1968 provide that the maximum number of participants at ordinary parties would be 50 and at marriages and funerals 150. Maximum number of courses allowed at meals is 4.

Uttar Pradesh

The U.P. Foodgrains (Restrictions on Consumption) Order, 1966 issued by the U.P. Government on the 29-10-66 was amended on 25-1-68, according to which the number of participants at ordinary parties was fixed at 50 and at marriages and funerals 150. The maximum number of courses at meals is 3.

West Bengal

The West Bengal Guest Control Order, 1967, issued on 1-2-67 which came into force with effect from 8-2-67 was revised on 5-3-68, according to which there are restrictions on preparation and consumption and distribution of prohibited foodstuffs to more than 25 persons at ordinary parties or to more than 50 persons (including host(s) in connection with marriages or funerals.

The West Bengal Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order, 1967 which came into force with effect from 7-3-67 was amended on 13-6-68. The maximum number of courses to be served is 4. Catering Establishments are also prohibited to serve any foodstuffs containing rice or preparations of rice on Thursdays.

Delhi

The Delhi Administration issued the revised Guest Control Order and the Delhi Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order on 12-1-68 which came into force on the same date whereby the maximum number of participants allowed at ordinary parties is 50 and at marriages/funerals 150. Maximum number of courses allowed at meals is 4. No sweet preparation is allowed to be served where the number of participants exceed the limit of 150 and 50 in marriage/funeral parties and ordinary parties respectively.

Pondicherry

The Pondicherry Guest Control Order and the Pondicherry Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order, were amended on 6-3-68. According to these, the maximum number of guests allowed at ordinary parties is 50 and at marriages and funerals 150. Maximum number of courses allowed at meals is 4.

Tripura

The Tripura Guest Control Order and the Tripura Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order issued in 1965 were last amended on 20-2-68 and came into force on 20-4-68 whereby the maximum number of participants allowed at ordinary parties is 50 and at marriages and funerals 150. Maximum number of courses allowed at parties/meals is 4. No sweet preparation and all foodstuffs prepared from or containing cereals or pulses is allowed to be served where the number of participants exceeds the limit of 150 and 50 in marriages/funerals and ordinary parties respectively.

Goa, Daman & Diu

Goa, Daman & Diu Guest Control Order, 1968 was issued on 18-4-68. According to this, the maximum number of guests allowed at ordinary parties is 50 and at marriages and funerals 150. Maximum number of courses allowed at meals is 4 according to the Goa, Daman and Diu Food (Restrictions on Service of Meals by Catering Establishments) Order, 1968 issued on 17-4-1968.

Maharashtra

- July, 1968 . . . By a Notification issued on 10-7-68 under section 3(2) of Essential Commodities Act, 1955, the ration shops have been made liable to return any ration card which is with them to the holder or surrender it to the nearest Rationing Office within three days (excluding holidays).
- December, 1968 . . . By a Notification issued on 4-12-68 under section 3(2) of Essential Commodities Act, 1955, bajra was derationed in the statutorily rationed areas.

Tamil Nadu

- December, 1968 . . . The Madras Rationing Order, 1965 was re-issued as Madras Rationing Order, 1968 w.e.f. 20-12-68 modifying the preamble indicating therein the necessity and expediency for issuing the Order, amending the provision relating to inspection and seizure of stocks to provide for seizure whenever the authorities have reasons to believe that any provision of the Order has been contravened in respect of seizure on mere suspicion.

West Bengal

- January, 1968 . . . By an Executive Order issued, the quantum of ration was increased to 2000 gms. per adult per week out of which the maximum permissible quantity of rice was fixed at 750 gms. w.e.f. 15-1-68.

- By an Executive Order issued, the quantum of ration was increased to 2600 gms. per adult per week out of which the maximum permissible quantity of rice was fixed at 850 gms.
- Children are entitled to half the quantum fixed for adults.

G.S.R. 1842, dated the 24-12-64 was further amended by the Central Government on 6-7-68, whereby six Orders each of Bihar, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal Governments, five Orders of the Delhi Administration and One Order of Dadra and Nagar Haveli were declared as Special Orders under Section 12 of the Essential Commodities Act 1955 for the purposes of summary trial. G.S.R. 1842, dated 24-12-64 was amended by the Central Government on 11-7-68 whereby one Order of the West Bengal Government was declared as Special Order under Section 12A of the Essential Commodities Act 1955 for the purposes of summary trial.

- October, 1968 . . . G.S.R. 1842, dated 24-12-68 was further amended by the Central Government on 18-10-68 whereby seven Orders of the Gujarat Government were declared as Special Orders under Section 12A of the Essential Commodities Act, 1955 for the purposes of summary trial.

NOTE.—Statutory rationing was withdrawn from Siliguri (West Bengal), Kanpur (Uttar Pradesh) & Delhi w.e.f. 1-1-68, 16-1-68 and 28-8-68 respectively.

January, 1969 G.S.R. 1842, dated 24.12.68 was amended by the Central Government on 10.1.69, whereby one Order of the Gujarat Government and two Orders of the West Bengal Government were declared as Special Orders under Section 12A of the Essential Commodities Act, 1955 for the purposes of summary trial.

B. States

Andhra Pradesh

February, 1967* The Andhra Pradesh Exhibition of Price Lists of Goods Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 23.2.67 whereby item 33 pertaining to Fire-wood was omitted from the purview of the Order.

June, 1967* The Andhra Pradesh Exhibition of Price Lists of the Goods Order, 1966 was further amended by the State Government on 30.6.67 whereby General Lighting Service Lamps and Flourescent Tubes were also included in the Schedule of the Order.

November, 1967* The Andhra Pradesh Exhibition of Price Lists of Goods Order, 1966 was further amended by the State Government on 23.11.67, whereby some coarse grains like jowar, jonna etc. were included in the Schedule of the Order.

February, 1968 The Andhra Pradesh Paddy and Rice (Declaration and Requisitioning of Stocks) Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 20.2.68 whereby the Special Duty Collector and the Special Tehsildar working at or incharge of Mobile Check Posts were also empowered to issue requisitioning orders.

Kerala

January, 1968 The Kerala Paddy and Rice (Declaration and Requisitioning of Stocks) Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 22.1.68 whereby the words "has reasons to believe" were substituted for the word "suspects" in sub-clause 'e' of clause 7 pertaining to seizing of stock of paddy or rice of the said Order.

April, 1968 The Kerala Paddy and Rice (Declaration and Requisitioning of Stocks) Order, 1966 was further amended on 20.4.68 by the State Government whereby the words "Authorised retail distributors and Authorised wholesale distributors" appointed under the Kerala Rationing Order, 1966 were substituted for the words "any Hospital, Educational Institute or Orphanage".

Madras

September, 1968 The Madras Cholam and Ragi (Declaration and Requisitioning of Stocks) Order, 1966 was rescinded by the State Government on 12.9.68.

Uttar Pradesh

February, 1968 The Uttar Pradesh Foodgrains (Restrictions on Hoarding) Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 14.2.68 whereby the storage of foodgrains by a licensed and approved dealer in a godown of the Central Warehousing corporation or the State Warehousing Corporation etc. was exempted from the purview of the Order.

April, 1968 The Uttar Pradesh Foodgrains (Restrictions on Hoarding) Second Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 10.4.68 whereby gram, jowar, bajra, maize and barley were deleted from the Schedule of the article of Hoarding Order, 1966. As a result of this amendment only wheat, rice and paddy were left in the Schedule of the article to which the Hoarding Order 1966 was applicable.

June, 1968 The Uttar Pradesh Foodgrains (Restrictions on Hoarding) Third Amendment Order, 1968 was issued by the State Government on 15.6.68 whereby wheat was also deleted from the Schedule of articles of the Hoarding Order. As a result of this amendment the said Order applied to rice and paddy only.

West Bengal

November, 1967 The West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Storage and Consumer) Control Order, 1967 was amended by the State Government on 10.11.67, whereby the limit of the quantity permitted to be stored was reduced from 2.6 quintals to 1.87 quintals of rice and in respect of paddy from 3.9 quintals to 2.8 quintals. In case of both rice and paddy, the limit was reduced from 3.9 quintals to 2.8 quintals. The West Bengal Foodstuffs Anti-Hoarding Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 10.11.67 whereby the movement or possession of any foodstuff was exempted in respect of following :

- (a) by or on behalf of the Government,
- (b) by a member of the Defence personnel on leave, and
- (c) under and in accordance with Ministry credit notes.

*These three Orders were issued by the State and copies of the Orders were received late.

- December, 1967 The West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Declaration of Stocks and Licensing) Order, 1967 was repealed by the State Government and another Order called the West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Licensing and Control) Order, 1967 was issued on 5-12-67. The West Bengal Foodstuffs Anti-Hoarding Order, 1968 was amended by the State Government on 30-12-67 substituting Form A(1) by a new Form A(1).
- January, 1968 The West Bengal Foodgrains (Requisitioning) Order, 1967 was amended by the West Bengal Government on 10-1-68, whereby the exemption limit was reduced from 37.5 kilograms to 37.00 kilograms of paddy per member per month where rationing Order, 1964 was not in force.
- November, 1968 The West Bengal Rice and Paddy (Licensing Control) Order, 1967 was amended on 19-11-67 whereby a licensed wholesaler could store for sale upto 250 quintals of rice at a time instead of 200 quintals allowed at a time earlier.

VII. MISCELLANEOUS

A. General

- March, 1968 The Indian Maize (Temporary Use in Starch Manufacture in Haryana) Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 8-3-68 permitting purchase and use of Indian maize for manufacture of starch upto 2000 tonnes in Haryana.
- June, 1968 The Indian Maize (Temporary Use in Starch Manufacture in Gujarat) Order, 1968 was issued by the Central Government on 24-6-68 whereby starch factories were allowed to purchase or use maize for the manufacture of starch under and in accordance with a permit issued by the D.G. Technical Development, Ministry of Industry, Government of India upto 15-9-68 not exceeding fourteen thousand and two hundred tonnes.

B. States

Kerala

- September, 1968 The Kerala Paddy (Restriction on Milling) Order, 1967 was repealed by the State Government on 9-9-68 with the issue of the Kerala Paddy (Restriction on Milling) Order, 1968.

Maharashtra

- October, 1968 The Maharashtra Poha and Kurmura (Restriction on Milling) Order, 1966 was amended by the State Government on 2-10-68 extending the validity of the Order upto 30-11-69.

APPENDIX III

Systems of Procurement of Foodgrains

Procurement of foodgrains is a State subject and it is for the States to decide about the systems of procurement keeping in view the local conditions. The main crops in India are rice (Kharif) and wheat (Rabi).

I. The systems of procurement in respect of paddy/rice in the various rice producing States are given below :—

Andhra Pradesh

- (a) Graded levy on producers.
- (b) Percentage levy on rice mills.
- (c) Open market purchases.

The F.C.I. is entrusted with the task of procurement as an agent of the Government.

Assam

Monopoly purchase—purchases are made at maximum controlled prices. The procurement is done through the Apex Co-operative Marketing Society as well as the Food Corporation of India.

Bihar

- (a) Levy on producers on an acreage basis except from unirrigated land in scarcity districts.
- (b) Levy on rice millers/hullers—25% of rice milled/hulled on miller's account.

Gujarat

Graded levy on producers. The procurement is to be done through the agency of the District Co-operative Purchase and Sale Unions.

Haryana

Levy on millers/dealers. The percentage of levy is 90% and the purchases are made at procurement prices fixed by the State Government.

Kerala

- Graded levy on producers.

Madhya Pradesh

Levy on rice millers/hullers—percentage of levy 60. Under the Levy Order F.C.I. are purchase officers for all licensed millers/dealers other than those rice mills run by Co-operative Societies. For mills run by registered Co-operative Societies the State Government have been authorised to appoint any authority as 'Purchase Officer'.

Madras

Procurement of paddy through ad hoc requisitioning of stocks under a Declaration and Requisitioning of Stocks Order.

The purchases are made at the maximum controlled prices. The F.C.I., the Co-operatives are acting as agents of procurement.

Maharashtra

- (a) Monopoly procurement of paddy.
- (b) 100% levy on millers.

Purchases are made through the Maharashtra Apex Co-operative Marketing Society at prices specially fixed by the State Government for purpose of procurement.

Mysore

Graded levy on producers on acreage basis. Procurement is done solely through Co-operatives at prices specially fixed by the State Government.

Orissa

Monopoly procurement. Purchases are made through the F.C.I. who are acting as sole agents of the State Government.

Punjab

Levy on millers/dealers—82% levy. Purchases are made at maximum controlled prices fixed by the State Government.

Uttar Pradesh

Levy on millers/dealers, at 60%.

West Bengal

- (a) Graded levy on producers.
- (b) Levy on rice millers—50% with effect from 1-11-68.

II. The systems of procurement in respect of rabi foodgrains during the 1968-69 marketing season followed by the concerned States are indicated below :

Haryana

System of pre-emption in the auction in the regulated markets. The State Government is the main procuring agency.

Madhya Pradesh

Levy on foodgrains dealers—50%.

Punjab

System of pre-emption in the auction in the regulated markets.

The State Government, F.C.I. and the State Marketing Federation are the procuring agencies.

Rajasthan

System of pre-emption in auction in the markets of the State.

Uttar Pradesh

Open market purchases.

The F.C.I. has been allowed to operate in most of the important mandies.

APPENDIX IV

Reserve Bank Directives regarding Control of Credit against Foodgrains, Sugar, Gur, Oilseeds and Vegetable Oils (including Vanaspati)

I. Against Foodgrains

During the year 1968, the Reserve Bank of India continued to regulate bank advances with a view to curbing speculative hoarding of foodgrains as also to facilitate procurement operation of foodgrains. According to the directive issued by Reserve Bank of India, Bombay on 13-4-67, the ceiling of average aggregate level of credit against the Security of rice and paddy was continued at 55 per cent of the average level of credit in the corresponding two month period in 1964-65 in the case of Andhra Pradesh and at 65 per cent in the case of other States (taken together except Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra). In the case of Maharashtra the ceiling limit was continued at 50 per cent of the average aggregate level of credit maintained in the corresponding two month period in the year 1964-65. The minimum margin of 50 per cent prescribed for advances against rice and paddy and the preferential margin of 40 per cent in respect of advances against warehouse receipts of the Central and State Warehousing Corporations were also continued.

In view of the fall in prices of paddy and rice in the districts of north Bihar and West Bengal, the Reserve Bank of India exempted the rice mills located in certain districts of north Bihar through its directive dated 18-12-68 and the rice mills located in West Bengal through its directive dated 15-1-69 from the purview of ceiling and margin restrictions stipulated under its directive of April, 1967.

In view of the comfortable supply position in respect of wheat during 1967-68 and the subsequent fall in prices, the Reserve Bank of India decided to relax its Control on advances against wheat under the directive dated 7-8-68. In terms of this directive, the ceiling on bank's advances against wheat during each two-month period commencing from August-September, 1968 has been fixed at 110 per cent of the outstanding level in 1967 or 100 per cent of the outstanding level in 1964-65 (August-July) whichever is higher and this ceiling limit has been fixed separately for (a) States of Punjab, Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Union Territories of Delhi and Chandigarh and (b) all other States and Union Territories taken together. The minimum margin has also been reduced from 50 per cent to 35 per cent in the case of advances other than warehouse advances and from 40 per cent to 25 per cent in respect of advances against warehouse receipts.

In the case of "other foodgrains" i.e. other than paddy, rice and wheat, the credit restrictions were relaxed by the Reserve Bank of India through its directive dated 27-5-68. According to this directive the ceiling of a bank's advances against "other foodgrains" has been fixed at 100 per cent of the outstanding level in 1967 or 100 per cent of the outstanding level in 1964-65 (May-April) whichever is higher separately for Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and group of other States taken together. The minimum margin has also been reduced from 50 per cent to 35 per cent in the case of non-warehouse advances and from 40 per cent to 25 per cent in the case of warehouse advances.

II. Against Sugar

On 27th April, 1963, the Reserve Bank issued a directive whereby the banks are required to maintain minimum margin requirement at 45 per cent of the value of the stocks of sugar to (a) parties other than those manufacturing sugar and (b) parties manufacturing sugar in respect of such stocks as have left the factory or mills premises and in which excise duty has been paid.

III. Against Gur

The advances against gur were brought within the purview of credit control for the first time under a directive issued on 2-11-67. In terms of this directive, the banks are required to maintain in each two-month period commencing from November-December, 1967 an average aggregate level of credit which is not to exceed 70 per cent of the level of such advances actually maintained in the corresponding two-month period of 1966-67. The minimum margin has been fixed at 50 per cent of the value of the relative stocks of gur pledged/hypothecated with banks.

IV. Against Groundnuts, Other Oilseeds (other than groundnuts, gingelly seeds and cotton seeds) and Vegetable Oils (incld. vanaspati)

Groundnuts.—In terms of the directive issued on 8-11-68, the margin requirement on advances against groundnuts has been fixed at 45 per cent in the case of parties other than registered oil mills, the margin in respect of which has been fixed at 35 per cent. The ceiling limit on advances against groundnuts has been continued at 100 per cent of the actual level of credit maintained in the year 1967 separately for warehouse and non-warehouse advances.

Other Oilseeds.—At present, the advances against other oilseeds are governed under the directive issued by the Reserve Bank of India on 8-11-68. In terms of this directive, the minimum margin on advances against other oilseeds has been fixed at 45 per cent in the case of parties other than registered oil mills. In the case of registered oil mills, the margin has been fixed at 35 per cent. The ceiling limit on advances against 'other oilseeds' has been continued at 100 per cent of the actual level of credit maintained in the year 1967 separately for warehouse and non-warehouse advances.

Vegetable Oils (including vanaspati).—In terms of the directive issued on 8-11-68, the margin requirement on advances against vegetable oils (including vanaspati) has been fixed at 45 per cent to parties other than vanaspati manufacturers and registered oil mills. In the case of vanaspati manufacturers and registered oil mills, the margin has been fixed at 35 per cent. The ceiling limit on advances against vegetable oils has been continued at 100 per cent of the actual level of advances maintained in the corresponding period of 1967 separately in respect of (a) vanaspati manufacturers and registered oil mills and (b) others.

- (ii) Commercial Purchases.—The following commercial purchases of wheat were made from U.S.A. in 1968 :—
July, 1968 108·70 thousand metric tons.
October, 1968 99·90 thousand metric tons.

2. Canada

- (i) Gift.—(a) An amount of Canadian \$40 million for food gift was provided by the Government of Canada under the Canadian International Food Aid Programme. Against this aid, Agreements were signed on 19-3-68 and 7-6-68, with the Canadian Wheat Board, Winnipeg for Canadian \$=20 million each, which fetched a total of about 525·9 thousand metric tons of wheat.
(b) A further amount of Canadian \$30 million for food gift was provided by the Government of Canada. The amount has been given in advance and this would be adjusted against their food aid programme for the year 1969-70. Against this aid an agreement was signed on 27-12-69 with the Canadian Wheat Board, Winnipeg for Canadian \$28,823,053·75 for approximately 370,000 long tons of wheat under the Canadian International Development Agency Programme. A further 16,000 tons were directly allocated by the Canadian Government.
(ii) Commercial Purchases.—The following commercial purchases of wheat were made from Canada in 1968 :—
April, 1968 35·4 thousand metric tons.
June, 1968 69·0 thousand metric tons.

3. Australia

- (i) Gift.—The Government of Australia offered a gift of 70·0 thousand metric tons of wheat under the Food Aid Convention of the I.G.A. 1967. For this, letters were exchanged with the High Commission for Australia, New Delhi on 18-10-68.
(ii) Commercial Purchase.—Contract was signed on 5-1-68 for the purchase of a total quantity of 106·5 thousand metric tons of Australian wheat. Payment for this commercial purchase was to be spread over one year period.

4. U. K.

Gift.—The Government of the United Kingdom agreed to give to India food aid under the Food Aid Convention of the I.G.A. 1967 to the extent of 2·7 million pound sterling. A quantity of 1,12,500 metric tons of wheat has been purchased against this aid with our own funds, to be re-imburshed later by the Government of the United Kingdom.

5. Argentina

Gift.—The Government of Argentina has given a free gift of 5,000 metric tons of wheat.

RICE

- (1) An Agreement was signed on 5-3-68 for the pruchase of 40 thousand metric tons of rice from the U.A.R.
(2) An Agreement was signed on 7-3-68 for the purchase of 100 thousand long tons of rice (101·6 thousand metric tons) from Burma.
(3) An Agreement was signed on 18-6-68 for the purchase of 80 thousand metric tons of rice from Thailand.
(4) An Agreement was signed on 23-7-68 for the purchase of 40 thousand metric tons of rice from Thailand.
(5) A quantity of 1·9 thousand metric tons of rice was purchased from Burma through exchange of letters dated 6-9-68.
(6) A quantity of about 151 thousand metric tons of rice was purchased from private parties during the period December, 1967 to December, 1968.
