2. Certain draft rules were received some time ago for opinion imposing liability on villagers to patrol railway lines. Final orders have not yet been received. I have re--ceived reports from Tahsildars and Sub-divisional Officers that the patrol system is not working efficiently, and that it will not work efficiently unless suitable payments are made. The majority of villagers are generally very poor, and have got to earn their living during day time and necessarily to take rest at night. I am sure the question of payment is receiving the consideration of Government.
