Sir

I have the honor to inform you
that the latest intelligence, informs
us that the Boobie Howr Sing has
determined to hold out in the jungles
of Jugdeesbore where he has still a
large force, they appear however to be
short of ammunition especially caps, but
it is rumoured that he has good
hopes of the 65th joining him and
the Regulars from Segowlee are now
in the district of Saran and may
also repair to his assistance, I have
sent out to such all the boats between
this and Clunpah and have sent
along the boundary a reinforcement
of 200 of the 10th Zindars are expected tomorrow
and Major Sykes present believe it
to move on to Jugdeesbore with the
whole of his force, if this is carried out
we of course must accompany him
and I can set both on a ~~higher~~ ^{higher}
and in command of my 50 Sikhs
Mr McDonell and the detachment
of Sikhs with him have been recalled
by you. I would strongly urge upon you
the importance of protecting the Head

both at Buxar and Karutadee and
thus could be effected by moving the
Sudder Station to Buxar putting the
fort into thorough repair and leaving
me a small force of Europeans & Sikhs.
with 6 garrison guns or more if they can
be spared, which might easily be brought
up by steamer.

It is useless keeping up the force of the
zillah police they bolt on the 1st alarm
& care of no possible use. I have restab-
-lished the usual set Thamah Amalak
I police here with the additional force
appointed at the commencement of
the disturbances but I am certain
that they will again bolt the day the
force leaves the station.

We have formed a court composed of
civil & military officers, & have tried
and hung 9 of the volunteers. A Ma-
= homedan Baker who was appointed
magistrate, during my temporary retirement
also a young Mahomedan who had acted
as Zamadar and in that capacity printed
out, and aided in the murder of Ahmed
Ailey late ^{of} jail Darogah & a faithful
servant of government. also a Govt
Chupranch who took refuge under the Babo
and we several ploughed and released
a number of ^{Beth} mazanders, we burnt
the village of Mayut, close to the town,
from which quantities of ^{treasures}
property was taken and the inhabitants

of which assisted the rebels in their attack,
on our bungalow.-

The Sepoy judge records are our
proceedings. The cuttawaps are in
ruins, the records destroyed and except
a few of the Collectorate books there
is not a vestige of Government property
left and there is nothing to make it
desirable that Carrab should be maintained
as the Sudder Station.

I hope I need not urge very much the
claims of my gallant little band of
Sikhs who have set an example
to the whole of the country -
