REFERENCE TO LATER CASES.

From CAPTAIN J. S. DAVIES, Senior Assistant Commissioner, Lohardugga Division—(No. 122, dated the 5th February 1859.)

FORWARDED to the Secretary to the Government of Bengal, for the information of His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor of Bengal.

From CAPTAIN J. S. DAVIES, Senior Assistant Commissioner Loharduggah Division to the Commissioner of Chota Nagpore,—(No. 145, dated the 2nd February 1859.)

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to report, in continuation of my letter No, 143, dated the 29th ultimo, that I have this day received authentic information of a further body of 150 or 200 rebel Sepoys having escaped from Palamow; they are supposed to be a portion, or the whole of those attacked and dispersed by Captain Nation, on the 25th idem, in Pergunnah Kusmar, whence they proceeded North, and were reported at the Village of Gorey, in the Koonda Ilaynor, on the 29th ultimo, proceeding north easterly direction, due notice of which has been given to Colonel Simpson Principal Assistant Commissioner at Hazareebaugh and Mr. Davies, Deputy Magistrate of Sherghotty.

2. I have the reason to believe that few, if any mutineers, are now left either in Palamow or Chota Nagpore, this Pergunnah continues quite peaceable, the Bhogtah chiefs with their families are now fugitives in the jungles with but few followers, and yesterday they narrowly escaped capture. Captain Nation and Lieutenant Graham are still on their track, and no exertions are being spared to effect their apprehension.
