REFERENCE TO LATER CASES.

From H. D. H. FERGUSSON, Esq., Commissioner of Patna, to the Secretary to the Government of Bengal,—(No. 102, dated the 4th May 1860.) SIR,

With Government Order No. 2275, dated 15th October 1858, I had the honor to receive copy of a communication No. 239, dated 5th idem, from the Officiating Secretary to the Government of India, in the Military Department, sanctioning the payment to Mr. Burrows of a fixed rate of six Rupees an acre, on the actual quantity of the Jugdeespore jungle cut by him, in order to assist Military operations under Brigadier Douglas in 1858.

2. On Mr. W. F. McDonell being appointed Settlement Officer in Shahabad, he was directed to ascertain, by actual measurement, the sum due to Mr. Burrows on the above account.

I have now the honor to forward, in original, a report from Mr. McDonell, No. 81, dated 30th ultimo, with its enclosed figured Statement, showing the total sum due on the above account to be Rupees 37,995-14-3, which appearing correct I recommend for sanction.

A portion of the said sum, viz. Rupees 29,500, was advanced to Mr. Burrows from the Shahabad Treasury on different dates in 1858 and early in 1859, and these advances still remain unadjusted. I therefore solicit early orders on the subject.

The return of the enclosures is requested.

From W. F. McDonell, Esq., Settlement Officer of Shahabad, to the Commissioner of the Patna Division,--(No. 81, dated the 30th April 1860.)

With reference to your letter No. 190, of the 29th August 1859, I have now the honor to forward a Statement, showing the amount of jungle cut by Mr. Burrows in accordance with the directions of the Military Officer in Command of the Shahabad District, and also the amount due to him for the same, at the rate of 6 Rupees an acre, as per letter No. 239, dated the 5th October 1858, from the Officiating Secretary to the Government of India, in the Military Department, to the Secretary to the Government of Bengal.

2. Having been with Sir E. Lugard as Civil Officer throughout the time he was in Shahabad, I know exactly what portions of the jungle were cut in accordance with his directions; and from a copy of a note from Brigadier Douglas to Mr. Burrows, I find that the plan decided upon by the Brigadier was to cut down a strip half a mile wide extending through the whole length of the jungle, with cross gaps of the same breadth running East and SIR,

through the whole length of the jungle, with cross gaps of the same breadth running East and West at intervals of every half mile, leaving patches of half a mile broad standing in either

I have carefully measured the extent of jungle, both what has been cut and what has been left standing; and am ready to certify that to the best of my belief the account now sent in is a correct one, and that the jungle has been cut as directed by the Military Authorities.

4. The total area of the Estate known as the Jugdeespore jungles is Beegahs 14,196-3-3½, or Acres 8,872-2-16. Of this amount Acres 6,442-2-23¾ has been cut by Mr. Burrows, Acres 8,861-2-35¾ of jungle is still standing, and Acres 561-0-36 is land which had been

previously cleared and partly brought into cultivation.

5. Besides the amount of jungle cut in the Jugdeespore Estate, part of the jungle in the Villages of Dulcepoor, Busonnah, Rungrea and Toolsheepore, (as per Statement,) were cut in accordance with the orders of the Military Authorities. Dulcepoor belongs to Baboo Ritbunjun Sing and has been released from confiscation; half of Busonnah has also been released; Rungrea and Toolsheepore belong to royal subjects, but as the jungle in all these villages adjoined and in fact formed part of the Jugdeespore jungles it was cut.

6. In the North jungle 560 acres more than what was required by the Military Authorities has been cut, and this is consequently deducted.

7. Mr. Burrows by his lease is bound to clear 1,000 acres of jungle every year. This amount also has therefore been deducted.
8. The total amount to be paid to Mr. Burrows is 37,995-14-4. Of this he has received 29,500, leaving a balance still due to him of 8,495-14-4.
9. The papers accompanying your letter No. 190, of the 29th August last, are herewith returned, and a Map showing the jungle is also sent.
10. In conclusion I may state that Mr. Burrows has seen this statement, and agrees to order need not be included under this arrangement, and owing to the Coolies running away after receiving advances, and the constant fear of the Rebels' approach interfering with the work, the cost of cutting that portion of the jungle was more than 6 Rupees an acre. the cost of cutting that portion of the jungle was more than 6 Rupees an acre.


