At its first sitting several associations similar to the present association at Arrah were established in the more important towns of Bihar, to give practical effect to the resolutions passed at the annual conferences. Its object at the time of its establishment was to promote the interests of Bihari students by awarding prizes every year to the best of their speakers, writers, and sportsmen, and it had then nothing to do with politics. But there has been a remarkable change since some of the political men of Bihar began taking part in its deliberations. Mr. Sayyid Ho Imam, Barrister at Law (brother of the Hon'ble Mr. Sayid Ali Imam, Law Member), was the first president to introduce politics into a Presidential speech at Gaya in 1909. The younger section of the student community took the cue from him and are now not ashamed to see their association branded as a political institution. There are, however, yet some members of this conference who deprecate Mr. Hussan Imam's attempt to make it a political body. This institution has therefore to be watched now.
