Dear Sir,

I am directed to draw your attention to the paragraph, a copy of which is enclosed, which appeared in the "Express" of the 8th. instant, dealing with the release of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad. It is stated therein that the Maulana has not yet been released from the Ranchi Jail, but in fact he has at no time been confined in any jail in this Province. In 1916, he was interned at Ranchi under the Defence of India Rules and by the terms of the order he was forbidden to leave Ranchi. This restriction on his movements was cancelled by an order of this Government dated the 31st. December 1919. The statement of your correspondent is likely to create a false impression, and I am to express the hope that it will be corrected.

I have looked up the papers about Kalam Azad. Under our orders he is bound to remain at Ranchi, but of course we can relax them. In addition, however, there are orders of the Govts. of Bengal & Bombay prohibiting him from entering their territories & these orders we cannot relax.

My own view is ~~very~~ that we have no right to let him leave the province without

- (1) The permission of the Govt of India
- (2) The consent of the local Govt. to whose

territory he goes.

obviously it would take two or three days to obtain permission & consent.

But besides that it seems to me undesirable that Kalam Azad should be allowed to leave Ranchi at all. The whole affair has very much the appearance of a trap. It may be made a very similar application. He was told that he could not go & that a European dentist was coming to Ranchi. The dentist comes & stops his tooth, & he picks the stopping out again. I incline to the view that the tooth is a pretext for getting to the places he wants to visit & the fact that he names Bombay & Lucknow is significant.


Sir

I beg to address these few lines to you which I hope will receive due attention.

Under the orders of your Government I was interned in Ranchi in October 1916. ^{On 24th December 1916} ~~At that time~~ my house in Ranchi was searched by the Police Supdt. and all books and papers found there were taken away and a receipt with the list of those articles was given to me. Out of them a few books were returned to me before I was released, but as regard the greater part of hand written books & manuscripts, which are not returned to me up till now, I was told, that some of them were retained in Bankipur and the rest were sent over to Government of India.

After waiting for over a year I am now compelled to draw your attention to the matter and request you to move the authorities to return those books to me as early as possible as all of them are very important for my religious and literal
