It is stated therein that the Maulana has not yet been released from the Ranchi Jail, but in fact he has at no time been confined in any jail in this Province. In 1916, he was interned at Ranchi under the Defence of India Rules and by the terms of the order he was forbidden to leave Ranchi. This restriction on his movements was cancelled by an order of this Government dated the 31st. December 1919. The statement of your correspondent is likely to create a false impression, and I am to express the hope that it will be corrected.





I beg to address these few lines to you which I hope will receive due attention.

Under the orders of your Government I was interned in our 14th December 1916. At that time my house in Ranchi was searched by the Police Supdt. and all books and papers found there were taken away and a receipt with the list of those articles was given to me. Out of them a few books were returned to me before I was released, but as regard the greater part of hand written books & manuscripts, which are not returned to me up till now, I was told, that some of them were retained in Bankipur and the rest were sent over to Government of India.

After waiting for over a year I am now compelled to draw your attention to the matter and request you to move the authorities to return those books to me as early as possible as all of them are very important for my religious and literal
