Deputation of an officer of the Indian Civil Service from Bihar and Orissa for legal training in the Legislative Department of the Government of India.

[No. 1.] From the Government of India, Legislative Department, No. 833, dated the 28th February 1913.

In 1901 the Government of India, after consulting the Local Governments, promulgated Appt. A, July 1901, No. 15 (18L-17) of 1901. a scheme for improving the agency available to Local Governments for drafting Bills in their Legislative Councils.

Appt., A, Nov. 1900, Nos. 23-24 (18L-23-1-2). The Government of Bengal, when they were consulted, supported the scheme and observed as follows:—

“Obviously, it is always desirable to have a few specialists in every service, and His Honour has no doubt that many a young Civilian of from five to eight years’ service, with a taste for law — particularly one who had already been called to the Bar — would gladly serve an apprenticeship of the kind with the Government of India without extra allowances. Even if he did not eventually become Legislative Secretary to his Local Government, the training would be valuable to him in such appointments as Registrar of the High Court, as Judge, and as Legal Remembrancer.”

The Government of India now enquire whether in accordance with that scheme this Government desire to depute an officer of the Indian Civil Service for legal training in the Legislative Department.

2. The conditions for such deputations are laid down in the Home Department letter Appt., A, July 1901, No. 15 (18L-17-1). Nos. 1036-1041, dated the 17th July 1901. As to the standing of the officers to be selected for such deputation the Government of India observe that a limit of five years’ service is too low, while that of eight to ten years too high, and direct that the only condition which need be insisted upon is that the officer to be deputed for training is not too senior. It is apparently the intention that officers of six and seven years’ standing should be selected. The officers named below are of such standing:—

1. Mr. E. L. Tanner (Gaya Settlements).
2. Mr. [H. A. F. Lindsay].
3. „ A. L. Inglis (Joint Magistrate, Patna).
4. „ J. E. Scott (Subdivisional Officer, Gumla, Ranchi).
5. „ S. B. Dhavle.
6. „ F. G. Rowland (Officiating Deputy Commissioner, Santal Parganas).
7. „ [H. D. G. Law].

Of the above Messrs. Lindsay and Law are on deputation under the Government of India and Mr. Dhavle is Under-Secretary to Government. The character reports of the above officers are put up.

Chief Secretary—

Of the officers between 5 and 8 years’ service there are none who can conveniently be spared for training in the Legislative Department. The officers mentioned above will all be required during the present hot weather, either in their present posts or in the acting vacancies which will occur. Of the officers of 1904 (Messrs. Collins, Philip, and Scroope), no one is available.

While of the officers of 1907, even apart for the fact that the Government of India think 5 years too young, are either not suitable or cannot be spared. The 1907 officers are Messrs. Hallett, Luby, Bridge (leave), Dain (leave), Sweeney (Settlement), and Beal. We may therefore reply in the negative to the Government of India.
